# 2. General Introduction

When it comes to ultra-portability, MaxiPRO MP808TS (hereinafter referred to as MP808TS) is your perfect companion. Featuring a fast quad-core processor, MP808TS offers maximum convenience and swift diagnosis. The intuitive user interface makes using the device effortless through a 7-inch LCD touch screen that displays at 1024 x 600 quality. Together with the ability to quickly read and clear Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEM) enhanced codes for TPMS module of the majority of the makes and models on the market, MP808TS provides you with superior special functions for TPMS services with ease.

There are two main components of the MP808TS system:

- MP808TS tablet the central processor and monitor for the system.
- MaxiVCI Mini (Vehicle Communication Interface) the device for accessing vehicle data.

This manual describes the construction and operation of both the devices and how they work together to deliver diagnostic solutions.

## MaxiPRO MP808TS Tablet

# **Function Description**

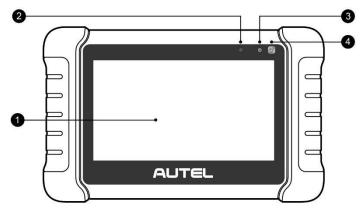


Figure 2-1 MaxiPRO MP808TS, Front View

- 1. 7.0" LCD Capacitive Touchscreen
- 2. Ambient Light Sensor detects ambient brightness.
- 3. Power LED indicates battery level & charging or system status.
- 4. TPMS Service Symbol indicates the position of the embedded TPMS antenna.

The power LED displays green, yellow or red depending on power level and operating state:

#### A. Green

- Illuminates green when the tablet is charging and the battery level is above 90%.
- Illuminates green when the tablet is powered on and the battery level is above 15%.

#### B. Yellow

Illuminates yellow when the tablet is charging and the battery level is below 90%.

#### C. Red

- Illuminates red when the tablet is powered on and the battery level is below 15%.
- 5. Collapsible Stand extends from the back to allow hands-free viewing of the tablet.

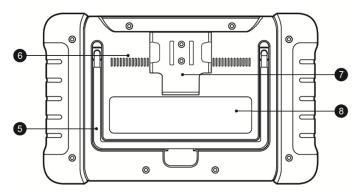


Figure 2-2 MaxiPRO MP808TS, Back View

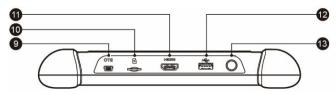


Figure 2-3 MaxiPRO MP808TS, Top View

## **Power Sources**

The tablet can receive power from any of the following sources:

- Internal Battery Pack
- External Power Supply

#### Internal Battery Pack

The tablet can be powered with the internal rechargeable battery, which if fully charged can provide sufficient power for about 7 hours of continuous operation.

## External Power Supply

The tablet can be powered from a wall socket using the USB external power adapter and the USB charging cable. The external power supply also charges the internal battery pack.

# VCI — Vehicle Communication Interface

The wireless diagnostic interface MaxiVCI Mini is a small vehicle communication interface (VCI) used to connect to a vehicle's DLC and connect wirelessly with the tablet for vehicle data transmission.

# **Function Description**

- Vehicle Data Connector (16-Pin) connects the MaxiVCI Mini to the vehicle's 16pin DLC directly.

- USB Port provides the easiest connection between the device and the tablet via a USB cable.

# 3. Getting Started

Ensure the tablet is sufficiently charged or is connected to the external power supply (see *Power Sources*).

# **Powering Up**

Press the **Lock/Power** button on the top right side of the tablet to power the unit on. The system boots, and displays the lock screen. Slide the Lock icon to the left to access the MaxiPRO Job Menu or slide to the right to unlock.

## ✓ NOTE

The tablet screen is locked by default when first powered on. It is recommended to lock the screen to protect the information in the system and reduce the power consumption.

The touch screen navigation is menu driven enabling quick access to functions and features by tapping on options headings and answering dialog windows. Detailed descriptions of the menu structures are found in application chapters.

# **Powering Down**

All vehicle communications must be terminated before powering off the tablet. A warning message will display if the unit attempts to power off while still connected with the vehicle. Forcing the tablet to power off while the unit is still communicating with the vehicle may lead to ECM problems on some vehicles. Exit diagnostics applications before powering off.

## > To power down the tablet

- Long press the Lock/Power Button.
- 2. Tap Power off option.
- 3. Tap **OK**, the tablet will turn off in a few seconds.

# **Reboot System**

In case of system crash, long press the **Lock/Power** button and tap **Reboot** option to reboot the system.

# 4. Diagnostics

By establishing a data link to the electronic control units of the vehicle being serviced directly, the Diagnostics application allows you to retrieve ECU information, read & erase DTCs, view live data, and perform active tests. The Diagnostics application can access the electronic control unit (ECU) for various vehicle control systems, such as engine, transmission, antilock brake system (ABS), airbag system (SRS) and more.

# **Getting Started**

The Diagnostics operations require connecting the MaxiPRO MP808TS tablet to the test vehicle's DLC using the main cable.

# **Vehicle Menu Layout**

When the tablet device is properly connected to the vehicle, the platform is ready to start vehicle diagnosis. Tap the **Diagnostics** application button on the MaxiPRO MP808TS Job Menu and then the Vehicle Menu displays.

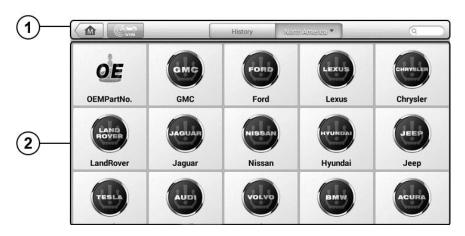


Figure 4-1 Sample Vehicle Menu

#### Vehicle Manufacturer Buttons

The Manufacturer buttons display the various vehicle logos and the brand names. Select the required manufacturer button after establishing the communication with the test vehicle to start a diagnostic session.

# **Vehicle Identification**

The MaxiPRO diagnostic system supports four methods for Vehicle Identification.

- Auto VIN Scan
- Manual VIN Input
- Automatic Selection
- Manual Selection

#### **Auto VIN Scan**

The MaxiPRO diagnostic system features the latest VIN-based Auto VIN Scan function to identify vehicles in just one touch, which allows the technician to quickly detect vehicles, scan all the diagnosable ECUs on every vehicle and run diagnostics on the selected system.

#### To perform Auto VIN Scan

- Tap the **Diagnostics** application button from the MaxiPRO Job Menu. The Vehicle Menu displays.
- 2. Tap the VIN Scan button on the top toolbar to open the dropdown list.

3. Select Auto Detect. Once the test vehicle is successfully identified, the screen will show you the vehicle VIN. Tap OK at the bottom to confirm. If the VIN does not match with the test vehicle's VIN, enter VIN manually or tap Read to acquire VIN again. Review the information to make sure it is correct. Tap Yes to confirm the vehicle profile or No if the information is not correct.

4. The tool would start establishing vehicle communication and reading control unit information. You can choose **Auto Scan** to scan all the available systems of the test vehicle or tap **Control Unit** to access the desired system that you want to diagnose.

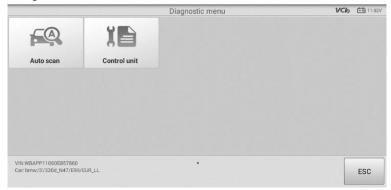


Figure 4-5 Sample Diagnostic Screen

## **Manual VIN Input**

For some vehicles that do not support the Auto VIN Scan function, the MaxiPRO diagnostic system allows you to enter the vehicle VIN manually.

#### To perform Manual VIN Input

- 1. Tap the **Diagnostics** application button from the MaxiPRO Job Menu. The Vehicle Menu displays.
- 2. Tap the VIN Scan button on the top toolbar to open the dropdown list.
- 3. Select Manual Input.
- 4. Tap the input box and enter the correct VIN.

- 5. Tap **Done**. The vehicle will be identified in a few seconds. Once the matching is successful, the system will guide you to the Vehicle Diagnostics screen directly.
- 6. Tap Cancel to exit Manual Input.

#### **Automatic Selection**

In some cases when users have selected the vehicle brand instead of performing Auto VIN Scan in the first place, the system still provides an option for vehicle VIN scan.

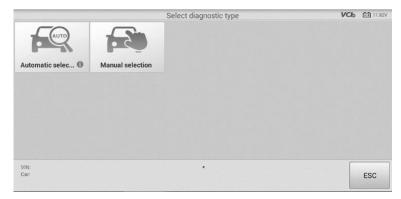


Figure 4-7 Sample Selection Screen

#### > To perform Automatic Selection

- Tap the **Diagnostics** application button from the MaxiPRO Job Menu. The Vehicle Menu displays.
- 2. Tap the vehicle brand of the test vehicle.
- 3. Tap **Automatic Selection** and the system will proceed to acquire VIN information automatically. Follow the on-screen instruction to go into diagnostic screen.

## **Manual Selection**

When the vehicle's VIN is not automatically retrievable through the vehicle's ECU, or the specific VIN is unknown, you can choose to select the vehicle manually.

This mode of vehicle selection is menu driven, repeat the first two steps from the automatic selection operation and tap **Manual Selection**. Then you can follow the onscreen prompts and make a series of choices. Each selection you make advances you to the next step. A **Back** button at the bottom right corner of the screen will bring you back to the previous step. Exact procedures may vary for different vehicles being serviced.

# **Diagnostics Screen Layout**

# Diagnostics Toolbar

The Diagnostics Toolbar contains a number of buttons that allow you to print or save the displayed data and make other controls. The table below provides a brief description for the operations of the Diagnostics Toolbar buttons.

#### > To print data in Diagnostics

- Tap the **Diagnostics** application button from the MaxiPRO Job Menu. The **Print** button on the diagnostic toolbar is available throughout the whole Diagnostics operations.
- 2. Tap **Print** whenever you want to make a printing. A drop-down menu appears. Tap **Print This Page** to print a screenshot copy of the current screen.
- 3. A temporary file will be created and sent to the P for printing.
- 4. When the file is transferred successfully, a confirmation message displays.

#### > To submit Data Logging reports in Diagnostics

- Tap the **Diagnostics** application button from the MaxiPRO Job Menu. The **Data Logging** button on the diagnostic toolbar is available throughout the whole Diagnostics operations.
- 2. Tap the **Data Logging** button. The button displays blue during the active recording process.
- 3. Tap the **Data Logging** button again to end recording. A submission form will display to let you fill in the report information.
- 4. Tap the **Send** button to submit the report form via the Internet. A confirmation

message displays when sending is successful.

#### Status Information Bar

The Status Information Bar at the top of the Main Section displays the following items:

- 1. Menu Title indicates the menu subject of the Main Section.
- 2. Voltage Icon indicates the voltage status of the vehicle.

#### Main Section

The Main Section of the screen varies depending on the stage of operations. The Main Section can show vehicle identification selections, the main menu, test data, messages, instructions, and other diagnostic information.

#### Function Buttons

The displayed Function Buttons at this section of the screen vary according to the stage of operations. They can be used to navigate, save or clear the diagnostic data, exit scanning as well as make other functional controls. The functions of these buttons will be introduced respectively in the following sections of the corresponding test operations.

# Screen Messages

Screen messages appear when additional input is needed before proceeding. There are mainly three types of on-screen messages as to their purposes: Confirmation, Warning, and Error.

# Confirmation Messages

Confirmation messages usually display as an "Information" screen, which inform you when you are about to perform an action that cannot be reversed or when an action has been initiated and your confirmation is needed to continue.

When a user-response is not required to continue, the message displays briefly before automatically disappearing.

## Warning Messages

Warning messages inform you when completing the selected action may result in an irreversible change or loss of data. The typical example for this is the "Erase Codes" message.

## Error Messages

Error messages inform you when a system or procedural error has occurred. Examples of possible errors include a disconnection or a communication interruption due to certain reasons.

# **Making Selections**

The Diagnostics application is a menu driven program that presents a series of choices one at a time. As you select from a menu, the next menu in the series displays. Each selection narrows the focus and leads to the desired test. Use your fingertip to make menu selections.

# Main Menu

The Diagnostics application allows you to establish a data link to the electronic control system of the test vehicle for vehicle diagnosis. You can operate functional tests, retrieve vehicle diagnostic information such as trouble codes, freeze frame data and live data for various vehicle control systems, such as engine, transmission, ABS, and more.

The Vehicle Diagnostics screen has two main options:

- **Diagnosis** a comprehensive section which includes all available functions: reading, clearing, saving and printing diagnostic information, as well as performing active tests and special functions.
- **Hot Function** a separate section designed to perform vehicle scheduled service and maintenance, such as to reset the service lights and perform calibration for various systems.

After a section is selected and the tablet establishes communication with the vehicle, the corresponding function menu or selection menu displays.

# **Diagnosis**

There are two options available when accessing the **Diagnosis** section:

- Auto Scan starts auto scanning for all the available systems on the vehicle.
- **Control Unit** displays a selection menu of all available control units of the test vehicle.

After a section is selected and the tablet establishes communication with the vehicle, the corresponding function menu or selection menu displays.

#### **Auto Scan**

The **Auto Scan** function performs a comprehensive scanning over all the ECUs in the vehicle's systems in order to locate and retrieve DTCs. The sample operation screen of **Auto Scan** displays as below:

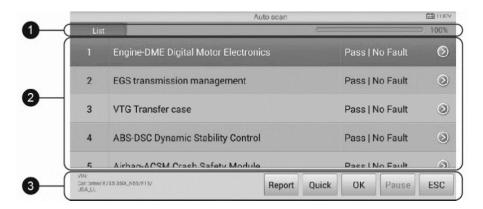


Figure 4-10 Sample Auto Scan Operation Screen

- 1. Navigation Bar
- 2. Main Section
- Function Buttons

#### Navigation Bar

- List Tab displays the scanned data in list format.
- Progress Bar indicates the test progress.

#### Main Section

- Column 1 displays the sequence numbers.
- Column 2 displays the scanned systems.
- Column 3 displays the diagnostic marks indicating different conditions of the test result:
- -!-: Indicates that the scanned system may not support the code reading function, or there is a communication error between the tablet and the control system.
- → -?-: Indicates that the vehicle control system has been detected, but the tablet cannot accurately locate it.
- Fault(s) | #: Fault(s) indicates there is/are detected fault code(s) present; "#" indicates the number of the detected faults.

- Pass | No Fault: Indicates the system has passed the scanning process and no fault has been detected.
- Column 4 tap the button to the right of the test result if you want to perform further diagnosis and other test activities. A Function Menu screen shall then display.

#### **Function Buttons**

The table below provides a brief description of the Function Buttons' operations in Auto Scan:

**Table 4-3 Function Buttons in Auto Scan** 

Name	Description
Report	Displays the diagnostic data in the report form.
Quick	Deletes codes. A warning message screen will display to inform you of possible data loss when this function is selected.
ок	Confirms the test result and continues system diagnosis after selecting the required system by tapping the item in the Main Section.
Pause	Suspends scanning and it will change to <b>Continue</b> button after tapping.
ESC	Returns to the previous screen or exits Auto Scan.

## **Control Unit**

This option allows you to manually locate a required control system for testing through a series of choices. Please follow the menu driven procedures and make proper selection each time. The program will guide you to the diagnostic function menu after a few choices you've made.

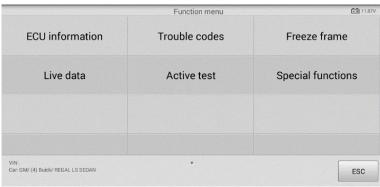


Figure 4-11 Sample Function Menu

The Function Menu options vary slightly for different vehicles. The function menu may include:

- ECU Information provides the retrieved ECU information in detail. Tap to open an information screen.
- Trouble Codes includes Read codes and Erase codes functions. Displays detailed information of DTC records retrieved from the test vehicle's ECU and erases DTC records and other data from the test vehicle's ECU.
- Freeze Frame displays the freeze frame data of the DTCs.
- Live Data retrieves and displays live data and parameters from the test vehicle's ECU.
- Active Test provides specific subsystem and component tests. This selection may appear as Actuators, Actuator Test, or Function Tests, etc., and the tests options vary depending on the manufacturer and model.
- Special Functions performs various component adaptations.

## ✓ NOTE

With the diagnostic toolbar on top of the screen throughout the whole diagnostic procedures, you are allowed to make various controls of the diagnostic information at any time, such as printing and saving the displayed data, getting help information, or performing data logging, etc.

#### > To perform a diagnostic function

- 1. Establish communication with the test vehicle.
- 2. Identify the test vehicle by selecting from the menu options.
- 3. Select the Diagnosis section.
- Locate the required system for testing by Auto Scan or through menu driven selections in Control Unit.
- 5. Select the desired diagnostic function from the **Function Menu**.

#### ECU Information

This function retrieves and displays the specific information for the tested control unit, including unit type, version numbers and other specifications.

The sample ECU Information screen displays as below:

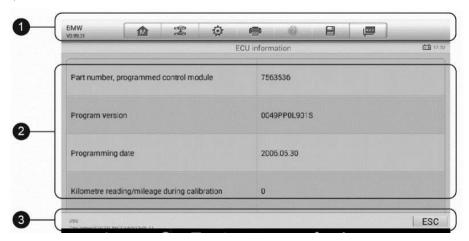


Figure 4-12 Sample ECU Information Screen

- 1. Diagnostics Toolbar Buttons see *Table 4-2 Diagnostics Toolbar Buttons* for detailed descriptions of the operations for each button.
- Main Section the left column displays the item names; the right column shows the specifications or descriptions.
- 3. Function Button in this case, only an **ESC** (or sometimes a **Back**) button is available; tap it to exit after viewing.

#### Trouble Codes

#### **Read Codes**

This function retrieves and displays the DTCs from the vehicle's control system. The Read Codes screen varies for each vehicle being tested. On some vehicles, freeze frame data can also be retrieved for viewing. The sample Read Codes screen displays as below:

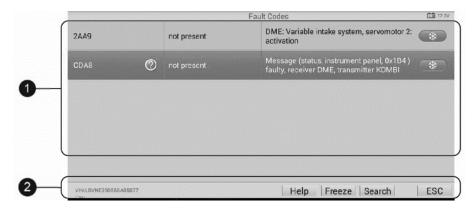


Figure 4-13 Sample Read Codes Screen

#### 1. Main Section

- Code Column displays the retrieved codes from the vehicle.
- Status Column indicates the status of the retrieved codes.
- Description Column detailed descriptions for the retrieved codes.
- Snowflake Icon only displays when freeze frame data is available for viewing; selecting this icon will display a data screen, which looks very similar to the Read Codes screen, therefore same operation method may be applied.

#### 2. Function Button

- Help tap this to view the information of the fault code, including fault description, condition for fault identification, driver information, etc.
- Freeze tap this to view the freeze.
- Search tap this icon to search the fault code related information in Google.
- ESC tap it to return to the previous screen or exit the function.

#### **Erase Codes**

After reading the retrieved codes from the vehicle and certain repairs have been carried out, you can erase the codes from the vehicle using this function. Before performing this function, make sure the vehicle's ignition key is in the **ON (RUN)** position with the engine off.

#### To erase codes

- 1. Tap **Trouble Codes** from the Function Menu, then tap **Erase Codes**.
- A warning message displays to inform you of data loss when this function is applied.
  - Tap Yes to continue. A confirming screen displays when the operation is successfully done.
  - b) Tap No to exit.
- 3. Tap **ESC** on the confirming screen to exit Erase Codes.
- Perform the Read Codes function again to check if the code erasing is successful.

#### Live Data

When this function is selected, the screen displays the data list for the selected module. The items available for any control module vary from one vehicle to another. The parameters display in the order that they are transmitted by the ECM, so expect variation between vehicles. Gesture scrolling allows you to quickly move through the data list. Simply swipe the screen up or down to locate the data you want. The figure below shows a typical Live Data screen:

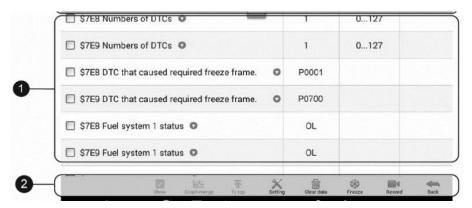


Figure 4-14 Sample Live Data Screen

#### Main Section

- Name Column displays the parameter names.
  - a) Check Box tap the check box on the left side of the parameter name to make selection of an item. Tap the check box again to deselect the item.
  - b) Drop-down Button tap the drop-down button on the right side of the parameter name opens a submenu, which provides various choices for data display mode.
- Value Column displays the values of the parameter items.
- Unit Column displays the unit for the parameters.

> To change the unit mode, tap the **Setting** button on the top toolbar and select a required mode. See *Unit* for more information.

#### **Display Mode**

There are 4 types of display modes available for data viewing, allowing you to view various types of parameters in the most suitable way.

Tapping the drop-down button on the right side of the parameter name opens a submenu. There are 4 buttons to configure the data display mode, and one Help button on the right that you can tap for additional information.

Each parameter item displays the selected mode independently.

- Analog Gauge Mode displays the parameters in form of an analog meter graph.
- 2) Text Mode this is the default mode which displays the parameters in texts and shows in list format.

## ✓ NOTE

Reading of status parameters, such as a switch reading, which are mostly in word form, like ON, OFF, ACTIVE, and ABORT, etc., can only be displayed in Text Mode. Whereas reading of value parameters, such as a sensor reading, can be displayed in text mode and other graph modes.

- 3) Waveform Graph Mode displays the parameters in waveform graphs.
- When this mode is applied, three control buttons will appear on the right side of the parameter item, allowing you to manipulate the display status.
- Text Button resumes Text Display Mode.
- Scale Button changes the scale values, which are displayed below the waveform graph. There are 4 scales available: x1, x2, x4 and x8.
- Zoom-in Button tap to display the selected data graph in full screen.
  - Edit Button tap this button to open an edit window, on which you can set the waveform color and the line thickness displayed for the selected parameter item.
  - Scale Button changes the scale values, which are displayed below the waveform graph. There are 4 scales available: x1, x2, x4 and x8.
  - ♦ Zoom-out Button exits full screen display.
- 4) Digital Gauge Mode displays the parameters in form of a digital gauge graph.

**Full Screen Display** — this option is only available in the waveform graph mode and mostly used in Graph Merge status for data comparison. There are three control buttons available on the top right side of the screen under this mode.

### > To edit the waveform color and line thickness in a data graph

- 1. Select 1 to 3 parameter items to display in Waveform Graph mode.
- 2. Tap the **Zoom-in Button** on the right to display the data graph in full screen.

- 3. Select a parameter item on the left column.
- 4. Select a desired sample color from the middle column.
- 5. Select a desired sample line thickness from the right column.
- 6. Repeat step 3-5 to edit the waveform for each parameter item.
- 7. Tap **Done** to save the setting and exit, or tap **Cancel** to exit without saving.

#### 2. Function Buttons

The operations of all the available function buttons on **Live Data** screen are described below:

**Back** — returns to the previous screen or exits the function.

**Record** — starts recording the retrieved live data; the recorded data is then stored as a video clip in the **Data Manager** application for future reviews. This function could be triggered automatically at preset threshold value or manually as you choose and the triggering mode and record duration can be configured in the **Setting** mode of **Live Data**.

**Freeze** — displays the retrieved data in freeze mode.

- Previous Frame moves to the previous frame in the freeze data.
- Next Frame moves to the next frame in the freeze data.

**Clear Data** — clears all previously retrieved parameter values at a cutting point whenever you choose.

**To Top** — moves a selected data item to the top of the list.

**Graph Merge** — tap this button to merge selected data graphs (for Waveform Graph Mode only). This function is very useful when making comparison between different parameters.

### ✓ NOTE

This mode supports Graph Merge for 2 to 3 parameter items only, so select no less than 2 and no more than 3 items each time when making graph merge.

> To cancel Graph Merge mode, tap the drop-down button on the right side of the parameter name and select a data display mode.

**Show** — tap this option to switch between the two options; one displays the selected parameter items, the other displays all the available items.

**Setting** — tap this button to open a setting screen, which allows you to set the trigger mode, recording duration, and various threshold values for data recording and make other controls.

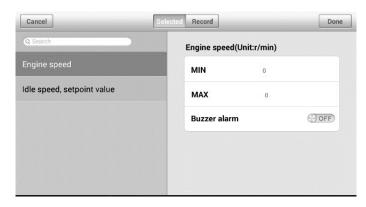


Figure 4-15 Sample Setting Mode in Live Data

There are four navigation buttons on top of the **Setting** mode screen.

- Selected Button displays the configuration screen on which you can set the threshold values, an upper limit and a lower limit, for triggering the buzzer alarm. This function is only applied to the Waveform Graph display mode.
  - a) MIN tap to open a virtual keyboard, allowing you to enter the required lower limit value.
  - MAX tap to open a virtual keyboard, allowing you to enter the required upper limit value.
  - c) Buzzer Alarm switches the alarm on and off. The alarm function makes a beep sound as a reminder whenever the data reading reaches the preset minimum or maximum point.

#### > To set threshold limits for the parameter values

- 1. Tap the **Setting** function button at the bottom of the Live Data screen.
- 2. Tap the **Selected** navigation button.
- Select a parameter item on the left column or enter the item name in the Search bar.
- 4. Tap on the right side of the **MIN** button and enter the required minimum value.
- 5. Tap on the right side of the **MAX** button and enter the required maximum value.
- Tap the **ON/OFF** button on the right side of the Buzzer Alarm button to turn it on or off.
- Tap **Done** to save the setting and return to the Live Data screen; or tap **Cancel** to exit without saving.

If the threshold limits are successfully set, two horizontal lines will appear on each of the data graphs (when Waveform Graph Mode is applied) to indicate the alarming point. The threshold lines are shown in different colors from the waveform of the parameters for distinction.

- Record Button displays the configuration screen for Record Setting, on which you
  can set the trigger type, duration and trigger point for the data recording function.
  - a) Trigger Type sets the trigger mode for data recording, mainly of two kinds: Manual and Auto. There are four options available:
    - 1) Manual allows you to manually start and stop data recording.
    - 2) DTC auto triggers data recording when any DTC is detected.
    - DTC Check Mode auto triggers data recording when certain pre-selected DTC types are detected.
    - Parameter auto triggers data recording when any parameter value reaches the preset threshold.
  - b) Duration sets the recording time (for Auto trigger mode only).
  - c) Trigger Point reserves a relative percentage of a record length before the data recording start point for reference (for Auto trigger mode only).

#### > To perform setting for live data record

- 1. Tap the **Setting** function button at the bottom of the Live Data screen.
- 2. Tap the **Record** navigation button.
- 3. Tap the button on the right of **Trigger Type** bar and select the required trigger mode.
- 4. Tap the button on the right of **Duration** bar and select a length of time.
- 5. Tap the button on the right of **Trigger Point** bar and select a relative percentage of a record length to be reserved before the data recording start point.
- 6. Tap **Done** to save the setting and return to the Live Data screen; or tap **Cancel** to cancel without saving and exit Setting.
- Done Button confirms and saves the setting, and returns you to the Live Data screen.
- Cancel Button cancels the setting operation and returns you to the Live Data screen.

#### Active Test

The **Active Test** function is used to access vehicle-specific subsystem and component tests. Available tests vary depending on the manufacturer, year, and model, and only the available tests display in the menu.

During an active test, the tablet sends commands to the ECU in order to drive the actuators. This test determines the integrity of the system or parts by reading the engine ECU data, or by monitoring the operation of the actuators, such as switching a solenoid, relay, or switch between two operating states.

Selecting **Active Test** opens a menu of test options that varies by make and model. Selecting a menu option activates the test. Follow on-screen instructions while performing tests. The content and pattern of the on-screen information vary according to the type of test being performed. Some toggle and variable control tests display Active Test Controls at the top of the screen with data stream information below, or vice versa.

The function buttons at the lower right corner of the Active Test screen manipulate the test signals. The operational instructions are displayed on the main section of the test screen. Simply follow the on-screen instructions and make appropriate selections to complete the tests. Each time when an operation is successfully executed, message such as "Command Finished", "Activation Successful", or something similar displays.

Tap the **ESC** function button to exit the test when finished.

### Special Functions

These functions perform various component adaptations, allowing you to recalibrate or configure certain components after making repairs or replacement.

The main menu displays the supported special functions for the test vehicle. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the desired function. When the operation is done, an

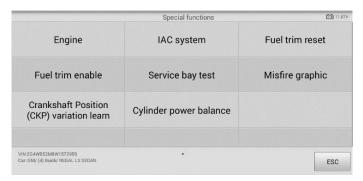


Figure 4-17 Sample Special Functions Screen

execution status message such as Completed, Finished or Successful, displays. Tap the **ESC** button to exit the function.

### **Hot Functions**

The Service section is specially designed to provide you with quick access to the vehicle systems for various scheduled service and maintenance performances. The typical service operation screen is a series of menu driven executive commands. By following the on-screen instructions to select appropriate execution options, enter correct values or data, and perform necessary actions, the system will guide you through the complete performance for various service operations.

The most commonly performed service functions include:

- Oil Reset Service
- TPMS Programming Service
- EPB Service
- ABS/SRS Services
- SAS Calibration Service
- DPF Regeneration Service

#### Oil Reset Service

This function allows you to perform reset for the Engine Oil Life system, which calculates an optimal oil life change interval depending on the vehicle driving conditions and climate. The Oil Life Reminder must be reset every time the oil is changed, so the system can calculate when the next oil change is required.

### Tire Pressure Monitor System (TPMS) Service

This function allows you to quickly look up the tire sensor IDs from the vehicle's ECU, as well as to perform TPMS programming and reset procedures after tire sensors are replaced.

### **Electric Parking Brake (EPB) Service**

This function has a multitude of usages to maintain the electronic braking system safely and effectively. The applications include deactivating and activating the brake control system, assisting with brake fluid control, opening and closing brake pads, and setting brakes after disc or pad replacement, etc.

### **ABS/SRS Services**

This function allows you to perform various bi-directional tests to check the operating conditions of both the Anti-lock Braking System and the Supplemental Restraint System, such as Automated Bleeding, Pump Motor Test, and checking Module information, etc.

### Steering Angle Sensor (SAS) Service

This service function allows you to perform calibration for the Steering Angle Sensor, which permanently stores the current steering wheel position as the straight-ahead position in the steering angle sensor EEPROM. On successful completion of the calibration, the steering angle sensor fault memory is automatically cleared.

### **DPF Regeneration Service**

The Diesel Particulate Filter service function performs the regeneration procedure which is the DPF cleaning operation to clear the blockage through continuous burning of the particulate matter captured in the DPF filter. If the DPF light on the vehicle comes on and you successfully complete a DPF regeneration cycle, you will notice that the DPF light will automatically turn off.

# **Generic OBDII Operations**

A fast-access option for OBDII/EOBD vehicle diagnosis is available on the Vehicle Menu screen. This option presents a quick way to check for DTCs, isolate the cause of an illuminated malfunction indicator lamp (MIL), check monitor status prior to emissions certification testing, verify repairs, and perform a number of other services that are emissions-related. The OBD direct access option is also used for testing OBDII/EOBD compliant vehicles that are not included in the Diagnostics database.

Functions of the diagnostics toolbar buttons at the top of the screen are the same as those available for specific vehicle diagnostics. See *Table 4-2 Diagnostics Toolbar Buttons* for details.

#### **General Procedure**

### To access the OBDII/EOBD diagnostics functions

- 1. Tap the **Diagnostics** application button from the MaxiPRO Job Menu. The Vehicle Menu displays.
- Tap the EOBD button. There are two options to establish communication with the vehicle.
  - Auto Scan when this option is selected, the diagnostic tool attempts to establish communication using each protocol in order to determine which one the vehicle is broadcasting on.
  - Protocol when this option is selected the screen opens a submenu of various protocols. A communication protocol is a standardized way of data communication between an ECM and a diagnostic tool. Global OBD may use several different communication protocols.
- 3. Select a specific protocol under the **Protocol** option. Wait for the OBDII Diagnostic Menu to display.

Tapping the (i) button displayed beside the function name opens a bubble with additional function information.

- 4. Select a function option to continue.
  - DTC & FFD
  - I/M Readiness
  - Live Data
  - O2 Sensor Monitor
  - On-Board Monitor
  - Component Test
  - Vehicle Information
  - Vehicle Status

### **⊘** NOTE

Some functions are supported only on certain vehicle makes.

### **Function Descriptions**

This section describes the various functions of each diagnostic option:

#### DTC & FFD

When this function is selected, the screen displays a list of Stored Codes and Pending Codes. When the Freeze Frame data of certain DTCs are available for viewing, a snowflake button will display on the right side of the DTC item. The erase codes function can be applied by tapping the **Clear DTC** button at the bottom of the screen.

#### Stored Codes

Stored codes are the current emission related DTCs from the ECM of the vehicle. OBDII/EOBD Codes have a priority according to their emission severity with higher priority codes overwriting lower priority codes. The priority of the code determines the illumination of the MIL and the codes erase procedure. Manufacturers rank codes differently, so expect to see differences between makes.

#### Pending Codes

These are codes whose setting conditions were met during the last drive cycle, but need to be met on two or more consecutive drive cycles before the DTC actually sets. The intended use of this service is to assist the service technician after a vehicle repair and after clearing diagnostic information by reporting test results after a driving cycle.

- a) If a test failed during the driving cycle, the DTC associated with that test is reported. If the pending fault does not occur again within 40 to 80 warm-up cycles, the fault is automatically cleared from memory.
- b) Test results reported by this service do not necessarily indicate a faulty component or system. If test results indicate another failure after additional driving, then a DTC is set to indicate a faulty component or system and the MIL is illuminated.

#### Freeze

In most cases the stored frame is the last DTC that occurred. Certain DTCs, which

have a greater impact on vehicle emission, have a higher priority. In these cases, the top prioritized DTC is the one for which the freeze frame records are retained. Freeze data includes a "snapshot" of critical parameter values at the time the DTC is set.

#### Clear DTC

This option is used to clear all emission related diagnostic data, such as DTCs, freeze frame data, and manufacturer specific enhanced data from the vehicle's ECM. A confirmation screen displays when the clear codes option is selected to prevent accidental loss of data. Select **Yes** on the confirmation screen to continue or **No** to exit.

#### I/M Readiness

This function is used to check the readiness of the monitoring system. It is an excellent function to use prior to having a vehicle inspected for compliance to a state emissions program. Selecting **I/M Readiness** opens a submenu with two choices:

- Since DTCs Cleared displays the status of monitors since the last time the DTCs are erased.
- This Driving Cycle displays the status of monitors since the beginning of the current drive cycle.

#### Live Data

This function displays the real time PID data from ECU. Displayed data includes analog inputs and outputs, digital inputs and outputs, and system status information broadcast on the vehicle data stream.

Live data can be displayed in various modes, see *Live Data* for detailed information.

#### O<sub>2</sub> Sensor Monitor

This option allows retrieval and viewing of O<sub>2</sub> sensor monitor test results for the most recently performed tests from the vehicle's on-board computer.

The O<sub>2</sub> Sensor Monitor test function is not supported by vehicles which communicate using a controller area network (CAN).

#### On-Board Monitor

This option allows you to view the results of On-Board Monitor tests. The tests are useful after servicing or after erasing a vehicle's control module memory.

### Component Test

This service enables bi-directional control of the ECM so that the diagnostic tool is able to transmit control commands to operate the vehicle systems. This function is useful in determining whether the ECM responds to a command well.

#### Vehicle Information

The option displays the vehicle identification number (VIN), the calibration identification, and the calibration verification number (CVN), and other information of the test vehicle.

#### Vehicle Status

This item is used to check the current condition of the vehicle, including communication protocols of OBDII modules, retrieved codes amount, status of the Malfunction Indicator Light (MIL), and other additional information.

# **Exiting Diagnostics**

The Diagnostics application remains open as long as there is an active communication with the vehicle. You must exit the diagnostics operation to stop all communications with the vehicle before closing the Diagnostics application.

### $\bigcirc$ NOTE

Damage to the vehicle electronic control module (ECM) may occur if communication is disrupted. Make sure all connections, such as USB cable and wireless connection, are properly connected at all times during testing. Exit all tests before disconnecting the test connection or powering down the tool.

#### > To exit the Diagnostics application

- 1. From an active diagnostic screen, tap the **Back** or **ESC** function button to exit a diagnostic session step-by-step.
- Or tap the Vehicle Swap button on the diagnostics toolbar to return to the Vehicle Menu screen.
- 3. From the Vehicle Menu screen, tap the **Home** button on the top toolbar; or tap the **Back** button on the navigation bar at the bottom of the screen.
- 4. Or tap the **Home** button on the diagnostics toolbar to exit the application directly and go back to the MaxiPRO Job Menu.

Now, the **Diagnostics** application is no longer communicating with the vehicle and it is safe to open other MaxiPRO applications or exit the MaxiPRO Diagnostic System and return to the Android System's Home screen.

# **5.** TPMS

MP808TS provides the most comprehensive TPMS services for technicians to quickly solve TPMS related problems in the shortest time and with the highest efficiency.

## **Getting Started**

  - Vehicle Manufacturer Buttons
- 3. Navigation Buttons
- 4. System Status Icons

#### Top toolbar Buttons

The operations of the Toolbar buttons at the top of the screen are described in the table below:

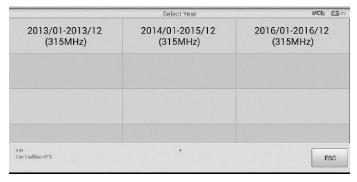


Figure 5-5 Sample Vehicle Year Selection 1

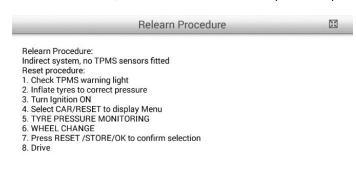


Figure 5-6 Sample TPMS Service Screen

#### Navigation Tab

The navigation tab at the top of the Main Section screen contains the following items:

- 1. Check Tab displays the triggered sensor data.
- 2. Diagnosis Tab displays the sensor IDs and DTCs saved in the TPMS ECU.
- 3. Programming Tab displays the triggered/retrieved sensor IDs and new programmed sensor IDs.
- 4. Relearn Tab displays the sensor Relearn procedure of the selected vehicle model.

The information of the test vehicle is displayed to the left of the four tabs. The VCI connection status and the battery level of the test vehicle are displayed to the right of the four tabs.

### **⊘** NOTE

Not all vehicles support **Diagnosis** function. If the selected vehicle model does not support Diagnosis, this tab will not display.

#### Main Section

The data including sensor ID and battery status, tire pressure and temperature plus vehicle specific relearn procedures display depending on operation.

#### Function Buttons

Specific Function buttons will display depending on operation. These buttons or icons can be used to trigger the TPMS sensor, create sensor IDs, program MX-Sensors and return to the previous screen or exit.

#### TPMS Check

The **Check** function allows user to activate TPMS sensor to view sensor data - sensor ID, tire pressure, tire temperature, battery condition and sensor position.

#### To check the sensors

- 1. Follow the steps in *Vehicle Selection* to select the test vehicle.
- 2. Hold the top right corner of the tablet close to the sensor mounted on the wheel. The trigger antenna is embedded in the tool's upper right hand corner.
- On the tablet, select the wheel you wish to trigger by either selecting the image of the wheel on the pictured vehicle or by selecting the corresponding wheel notation (FL, FR, RR, RL). Tap **Trigger** button to activate this sensor.
- Once the sensor is successfully triggered, the information of the sensor will display.

If the battery level of a sensor is low, a red low battery icon will display beside the wheel on the screen.

Once triggered, the wheel icons will display green or red indicating sensor status. Refer to *Table 5-2 Possible Results for Triggering* for details.

The sensor position, sensor ID, tire pressure, tire temperature, sensor frequency and sensor battery information of the triggered sensor will display on the table.

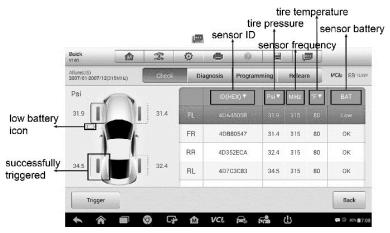


Figure 5-8 Sample Check Screen 2

# **TPMS Diagnosis**

The **Diagnosis** function is used to check the status of the TPMS system. This function requires connection with the test vehicle.

### **Establish Vehicle Communication**

The MP808TS Diagnostic Platform connects to the test vehicle using the MaxiVCI Mini. Perform the following steps to establish communication between the vehicle and the tablet:

- Connect the MaxiVCI Mini to the vehicle's DLC for both communication and power supply.
- 2. Connect the MaxiVCI Mini to the tablet via Bluetooth pairing.
- A green check will display atop the VCI navigation button at the bottom of the screen
  if communication has been established and the MP808TS is ready to start vehicle
  diagnosis.

#### Vehicle Connection

The tablet communicates with the vehicle via the Bluetooth connection provided by the MaxiVCI Mini.

To connect the MaxiVCI Mini to the test vehicle, insert the Vehicle Data Connector on the MaxiVCI Mini into the vehicle's DLC which is generally located under the vehicle dash and the MaxiVCI Mini will be automatically powered on.

### **⊘** NOTE

The vehicle's DLC is not always located under the dash; refer to the vehicle's user manual for DLC location.

#### VCI Connection

The MaxiVCI Mini Power LED will light solid green when properly connected to vehicle and ready to establish communication with the tablet.

The wireless diagnostic interface MaxiVCI Mini supports two communication methods with the tablet, Bluetooth and wired USB.

#### **Bluetooth Connection**

Bluetooth pairing is the recommended communication between the tablet and the MaxiVCI Mini. The working range for Bluetooth communication is about 33 feet (about 10 m), enabling remote vehicle diagnostics.

If you use more than one MaxiVCI Mini to connect to the test vehicles, you can perform vehicle diagnosis on various vehicles conveniently by pairing the tablet separately to each of the MaxiVCI Mini devices connected to the different test vehicles via Bluetooth. Without the need to repeat the plugging and unplugging procedure which is unavoidable through traditional wired connection, Bluetooth connection saves you more time and provides higher efficiency.

#### **USB Cable Connection**

Use the provided USB cable to connect the tablet and the MaxiVCI Mini. A green check will display atop the VCI navigation button at the bottom of the screen and the MaxiVCI Connection LED will light solid green when connection between the devices is successful.

### ✓ NOTE

The USB communication method will take priority over Bluetooth communication if both are enabled.

### No Communication Message

- A. An "Error" message will display if the MaxiVCI Mini is not connected correctly. To resolve this issue, please do the following.
  - Check if the MaxiVCI Mini is powered on.
  - Check if the MaxiVCI Mini is properly positioned.
  - Check if the Connection LED on the MaxiVCI Mini is illuminated for Bluetooth or USB.
  - In case of Bluetooth connection, check if the network is configured correctly, or

if the right MaxiVCI Mini has been paired up with the tablet.

- If communication is lost during diagnosis, ensure there is no nearby object that might cause signal interruption.
- Stand closer to the MaxiVCI Mini to obtain a stronger signal, and a faster communication speed.
- When using USB connection, check the cable connection between the tablet and the MaxiVCI Mini.
- Check the Power LED on the MaxiVCI Mini. A blinking red light indicates there
  is a hardware problem with the MaxiVCI Mini. Contact technical support for
  assistance.
- B. A message will display if the MaxiVCI Mini is unable to establish a communication link. The followings are the possible causes:
  - The MaxiVCI Mini is unable to establish a communication link with the vehicle.
  - The system selected for testing is not equipped on the vehicle.
  - There is a loose connection.
  - There is a blown vehicle fuse.
  - There is a wiring fault of the vehicle or the adapter.
  - There is a circuit fault in the adapter.
  - Incorrect vehicle identification was entered.

### **Diagnosis Operations**

Tap **Diagnosis**, the tablet will automatically communicate with the vehicle.

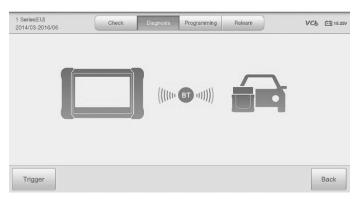


Figure 5-9 Sample Diagnosis Communication Screen

If the OBD function is supported by the test vehicle, the sensor ID saved in the TPMS ECU will be retrieved and displayed on the screen with an OBD icon adjacent to it.

If the sensor ID retrieved from sensor activation is the same as the ID saved in the ECU, the trigger mark ( and OBD mark ( solution) will display green.

If the IDs are different, the marks will display red ( and . In this case, the vehicle ECU cannot recognize the sensor installed on the vehicle.

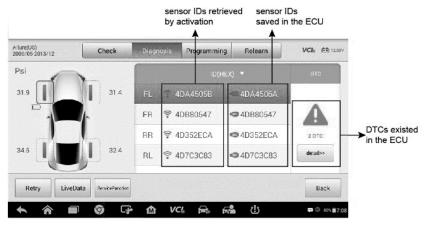


Figure 5-10 Sample Diagnosis Screen 1

If the OBD function is not supported by the test vehicle, the sensor ID saved in the TPMS ECU cannot be retrieved and only the sensor ID retrieved from sensor activation will display on the screen with a signal icon.

#### Details

If Diagnostic Trouble Codes (DTCs) are present in the TPMS ECU, a yellow hazard icon displays in the DTC column and the **details** button is available.

Tap details in the DTC column to view the detailed information of the DTCs.

In this screen, the detailed fault definition will display. Select one of the DTC and tap **Search**, the tablet will automatically connect to the Internet and additional information will display.

If no DTCs are present in the TPMS ECU, a green "No DTC" message will display on the DTC screen.

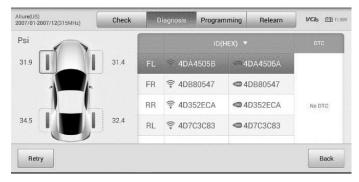


Figure 5-13 Sample No DTC Screen

#### Retry

Tap **Retry**, to establish communication with ECU again and retrieve sensor IDs and the DTCs present in the ECU.

#### Live Data

Tap Live Data to view the data stream of the sensor information.

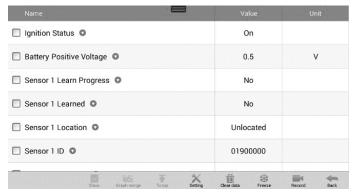


Figure 5-14 Sample Live Data Screen

Check the box before the parameters to display, the **Show** icon on the bottom of the screen will be available and display blue. Tap **Show** and the selected parameters will display on a separate screen.

For more details, please refer to Live Data.

### Special Functions

Tap this button to display a menu of available special functions.

Tap button to initiate desired vehicle lamp function test.

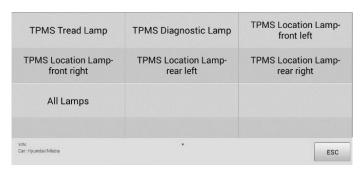


Figure 5-15 Sample Special Functions Screen

# Sensor Programming

The **Programming** function allows users to program the sensor data to the MX-Sensor to replace existing sensors with low battery life and ones that are no longer functioning.

This device offers four programming methods when programming MX-Sensor: Copy by Activation, Copy by OBD, Copy by Input and Auto Create.

The sensor IDs retrieved from sensor activation and TPMS ECU will display on the left column of the table with the appropriate signal or OBD icon.

If the OBD function is not supported by the test vehicle and the sensor ID saved in the ECU cannot be retrieved, the Programming screen displays as pictured below.

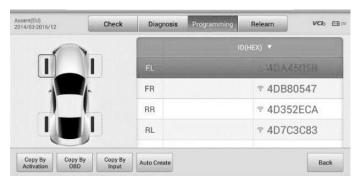


Figure 5-17 Sample Programming Screen 2

In this example, the OBD function is not supported by the test vehicle and therefore the **Copy by OBD** function will not display.

### Copy by Activation

Once the sensors mounted on the vehicle have been triggered and the sensor and tire information displayed on the tool, the **Copy by Activation** can use to program a new MX-Sensor.

Select a wheel location on the display and place a MX-Sensor near the top right corner of the tablet. Tap **Copy by Activation** to program a new MX-Sensor.

A window will display for your confirmation. Tap **OK** to program, or tap **Cancel** to quit the operation.

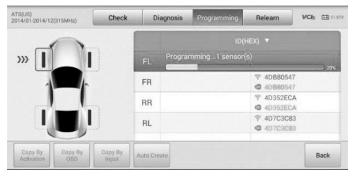


Figure 5-19 Sample Copy by Activation Screen

When the programming is complete, the programmed ID will display in the column to the right of the wheel designation. In the pictured example, the new ID is displayed to the right of the FL column.

By using **Copy by Activation**, the sensor ID that is retrieved from activated sensor is programmed to the new MX-Sensor.

Because the IDs of the original sensor and the new MX-Sensor are the same and the ID is already recognized to the vehicle ECU, there is no need to perform the **Relearn** function when the new programmed sensor has been attached to the same wheel.

If the IDs retrieved from sensor activation and those registered to the TPMS ECU are different, use **Copy by OBD** to program the IDs saved in the ECU to the new MX-Sensor.

### Copy by OBD

By using this function, the tablet will program the sensor IDs retrieved from the ECU of the test vehicle to the new MX-Sensors.

Select a wheel location on the display and place a MX-Sensor near the top right corner of the tablet. Tap **Copy by OBD** to program the new MX-Sensor.

When the programming is complete, the programmed ID will display in the column to the right of the wheel designation. In the pictured example, the new ID is displayed to the right of the FR column.

By using **Copy by OBD**, the sensor ID that is retrieved from TPMS ECU is programmed to the new MX-Sensor.

There is no need to perform the **Relearn** function to write the ID into the ECU when the new programmed sensor has been put in the same position.

The **Copy by OBD** programming method, if available, is recommended to program new MX-Sensors as there is no need for Relearn.

### Copy by Input

The **Copy by Input** allows users to program a new MX-Sensor with the ID of an original TPMS sensor.

Select a wheel location on the display and place a MX-Sensor near the top right corner of the tablet and then tap **Copy by Input** to program the new MX-Sensor.

Tap **Copy by Input**. When the input box displays, enter the ID of the original sensor. Tap inside the input box to display a soft keyboard. Once displayed, input the ID and tap **Enter** when finished.

Sensors either have a hexadecimal format or a decimal format. A warning message will display if too many characters are entered.

The **Copy by Input** programming method uses the ID of the original sensor that is already stored within the TPMS ECU and therefore does not require the sensor be relearned if the new programmed sensor has been put in the same position.

#### **Auto Create**

The **Auto Create** function is used to automatically create a random sensor ID to program a new MX-Sensor.

To use this function, there is no need to activate the original sensor or retrieve the original sensor IDs from the TPMS ECU.

Select the vehicle model, select a wheel location on the display and place a MX-Sensor near the top right corner of the tablet. Tap **Auto Create** to program the new MX-Sensor.

A random ID will be created for the MX-Sensor. This new ID differs from the ID stored in the TPMS ECU, therefore the sensor will have to be relearned to the TPMS ECU.

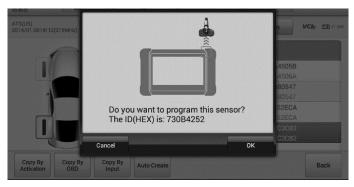


Figure 5-23 Sample Auto Create Screen

### **TPMS** Relearn

This function is used to write sensor IDs into the vehicle ECU for sensor recognition.

Relearn is needed to be performed when the new sensor IDs are different from the original sensor IDs stored within TPMS ECU.

There are THREE ways for Relearn.

- Stationary Relearn
- Automatic Relearn
- OBD Relearn

## **Stationary Relearn**

Stationary Relearn requires the vehicle be placed in the "Learn Mode".

Tap Relearn to access the relearn menu.

Then follow the **Relearn Procedure** to perform Stationary Relearn.

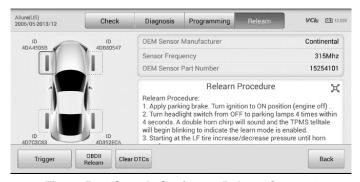


Figure 5-24 Sample Stationary Relearn Screen 1



- 1. Apply parking brake. Turn ignition to ON position (engine off) .
- Turn headlight switch from OFF to parking lamps 4 times within 4 seconds. A double horn chirp will sound and the TPMS telltale will begin blinking to indicate the learn mode is enabled.
- Starting at the LF tire increase/decrease pressure until horn sounds.
- 4. After horn sounds, proceed as in step 3 for the next 3 sensors in the following order: RF, RR LR.
- After LR sensor has been learned, turn ignition to OFF position. Adjust all tires to pressure listed on tire placard.
- If headlight switch does not enable TPMS Learn Mode, use TPMS Learn button on dash.

#### **Automatic Relearn**

For some vehicles, the Relearn function can be completed by driving. Refer to the onscreen Relearn Procedure for the exact details of the process.

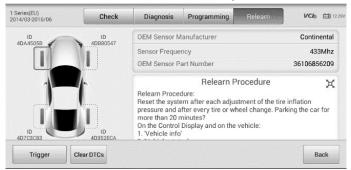


Figure 5-26 Sample Automatic Relearn Screen 1

Relearn Procedure

Relearn Procedure:

Reset the system after each adjustment of the tire inflation pressure and after every tire or wheel change. Parking the car for more than 20 minutes? On the Control Display and on the vehicle:

- 1. 'Vehicle info'
- 2. 'Vehicle status'
- 3. 'Perform reset'
- 4. Start the engine do not drive off.
- 5. Reset tire inflation pressure: 'Perform reset'.
- Drive away

The tires are shown in gray and the status is displayed. After driving faster than 19 mph/30 km/h for a short period, the set tire inflation pressures are accepted as reference values. The reset is completed automatically while driving.

After a successfully completed Reset, the wheels on the Control Display are shown in green and 'Tire Pressure Monitor (TPM) active' is displayed.

#### **OBDII Relearn**

#### OBDII Relearn

The OBDII Relearn function allows the MP808TS tablet to directly write the TPMS sensor IDs to the TPMS module.

### **⊘** NOTE

Not all the vehicles support the OBDII Relearn. If the selected vehicle supports OBDII Relearn, the OBDII Relearn button will display on the bottom of the screen.

To perform the **Relearn**, activate all four sensors.

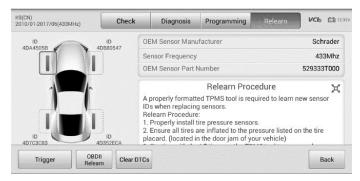


Figure 5-28 Sample OBDII Relearn Screen 1

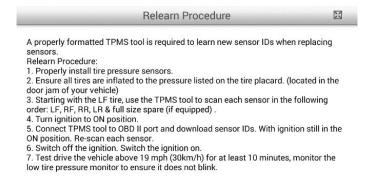


Figure 5-29 Sample OBDII Relearn Screen 2

#### OBDII-Assisted Relearn

The MP808TS also can perform an OBDII-Assisted Relearn. Some vehicles relearn procedure require that a tool be connected to the vehicle while another tool be used to trigger the sensor at the wheel.

Since the MP808TS tablet wirelessly communicates with vehicles, it can be used to trigger wheel-mounted sensors while still being connected with the vehicle eliminating the need for a second tool. The sensor IDs are then relearned to the vehicle.

After performing the Relearn procedure, tap **Clear DTCs** to clear the trouble codes present in the TPMS ECU.

# TPMS by OEM Part No.

If the sensor's OEM part number is known, this function is an efficient method to activate and program MX-Sensors.

### **Application Scenarios**

The following are two typical scenarios in which this method is ideal.

#### In the workshop

If the mounted sensor is faulty and the part number is known to the technician, the technician can use this method to Check the original sensor, and then write the information that was retrieved into a new MX-Sensor via **Programming.** The newly programmed MX-Sensor is ready to replace the original sensor and be installed on the vehicle.

#### In the tire shop

If a customer needs to replace one or more tires and sensors, or purchase a large amount of sensors for one vehicle model and the OEM part number of this model is known, this function can be used to program up to 20 sensors at the same time.

### **Function Operations**

 Tap OEM Part No. on the TPMS service menu to access the next screen. A list of sensor OEM part numbers will display. Swipe the screen left and right to find the correct OEM part number of the sensor on the test vehicle.

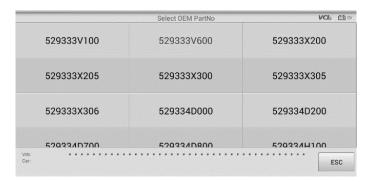


Figure 5-30 Sample OEM Part No. Screen

Only sensor **Check** and **Programming** functions are available with the OEM Part No. function. The **Diagnosis** and **Relearn** functions can only be accessed by selecting a vehicle on the TPMS service menu.

#### Check

The **Check** tab is the default selection on this menu. Tap **Trigger** on the bottom left of the screen to activate the original sensors and retrieve the sensor information. The original sensor ID, tire pressure, tire temperature, sensor battery, and sensor frequency will populate the displayed table.

### Programming

The programming function is used to program the sensor data to the MX-Sensor and replace the faulty sensor.

There are three options available when programming MX-Sensor using the OEM Part No. function: **Copy by Activation**, **Copy by Input**, **and Auto Create**. Refer to *Sensor Programming*.

#### **⊘** NOTE

**Auto Create** in this section can program up to 20 MX-Sensors at a time.

The **PSN Code** (Part Serial Number), which is printed on the MX-Sensor, acts as a reference to identify the corresponding sensor ID. This can be especially useful when programming multiple MX-Sensors.

### Support

Support will display the correct vehicle types for the selected OEM part number.

To conduct additional procedures such as Diagnosis and Relearn, select the correct test vehicle model and then tap **Enter Vehicle** at the bottom left of the screen. Refer to *TPMS Diagnosis* and *TPMS Relearn* for more details about the comprehensive TPMS functions menu.

# 6. Service

The **Service** section is specially designed to provide quick access to the vehicle systems for various scheduled service and maintenance tasks. The typical service operation screen is a series of menu driven executive commands. Follow on-screen instructions to select appropriate execution options, enter correct values or data, and perform necessary actions. The application will display detailed instructions to complete selected service operations.

Currently, the following service functions are available:

- Oil Reset Service
- EPB Service
- BMS Service
- DPF Service
- SAS Calibration Service
- IMMO Keys
- Other functions coming soon

After entering each special function, the screen will display two application choices: **Diagnosis** and **Hot Functions**. The **Diagnosis** enables the reading and clearing of codes which is sometimes necessary after completing certain special functions. **Hot Functions** consists of sub functions of the selected special function.

### **Oil Reset Service**

Perform reset for the Engine Oil Life system, which calculates an optimal oil life change interval depending on the vehicle driving conditions and climate. The Oil Life Reminder must be reset each time the oil is changed, so the system can calculate when the next oil change is required.

### **IMPORTANT**

Always reset the engine oil life to 100% after every oil change.

### ✓ NOTE

- All required work must be carried out before the service indicators are reset. Failure
  to do so may result in incorrect service values and cause DTCs to be stored by the
  relevant control module.
- For some vehicles, the scan tool can reset additional service lights such as maintenance cycle and service interval. On BMW vehicles for example, service resets include engine oil, spark plugs, front/rear brakes, coolant, particle filter, brake fluid, micro filter, vehicle inspection, exhaust emission inspection and vehicle checks.

#### > To perform oil reset functions

- 1. Tap the **Service** application button on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- Tap Oil Reset button. The vehicle manufacturer screen displays. Tap VIN Scan
  or the vehicle make to acquire vehicle VIN information and tap Yes to confirm.
  See Vehicle Identification for details.

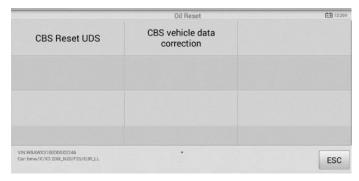


Figure 6-1 Sample Oil Reset Function List

- 3. Tap the desired function in the Oil Reset function list. The list may vary by test vehicle.
- 4. Follow the step-by-step on-screen instruction to complete the service. Using CBS Reset UDS as an example.
- 5. Tap CBS Reset UDS on the Oil Reset function list to start the operation. The screen will display the date and time and ask for confirmation. If the displayed date and time are correct, tap Yes to confirm. If no, tap No and go to the Settings menu to set the correct date and time.
- 6. The available items will display in a table of three columns: CBS value, availability, and service counter.

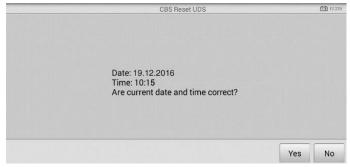


Figure 6-2 Sample Oil Reset Service Screen 1

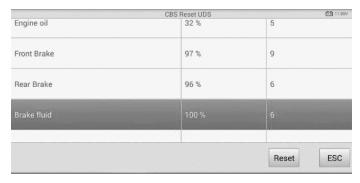


Figure 6-3 Sample Oil Reset Service Screen 2

# **Electric Parking Brake (EPB) Service**

This function has a multitude of usages to maintain the electronic braking system safely and effectively. The applications include deactivating and activating the brake control system, assisting with brake fluid control, opening and closing brake pads, and setting brakes after disc or pad replacement.

### **EPB Safety**

It can be dangerous to perform Electric Parking Brake (EPB) system maintenance, so before you begin the service work, please keep these rules in mind.

Ensure that you are fully familiar with the braking system and its operation before commencing any work.

- ✓ The EPB control system may be required to be deactivated before carrying out any
  maintenance/diagnostic work on the brake system. This can be done from the tool
  menu.
- Only perform maintenance work when the vehicle is stationary and on level ground.
- Ensure that the EPB control system is reactivated after the maintenance work has been completed.

#### **⊘** NOTE

Autel accepts no responsibility for any accident or injury arising from the maintenance of the Electric Parking Brake system.

#### > To perform EPB functions

- 1. Tap the **Service** application button on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- Tap EPB button. The vehicle manufacturer selection screen will display. Tap VIN
   Scan or the vehicle manufacturer to acquire vehicle VIN information and tap
   Yes to confirm. See Vehicle Identification for details.
- 3. Tap the desired service in the EPB function list. The list may vary for different vehicles being tested.

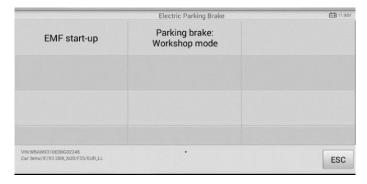


Figure 6-5 Sample EPB Function List

- 4. Follow the step-by-step on-screen instruction to complete the service.
- Press **OK** button to exit.

#### **EMF Start-up**

This service function would start the parking brake. It must be conducted after the following repairs:

- Replacing an EMF control unit.
- Replacing the parking brake button.

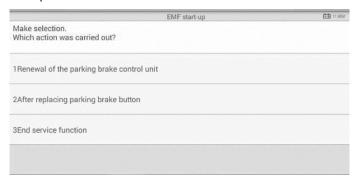


Figure 6-7 Sample EMF Start-up Screen 2

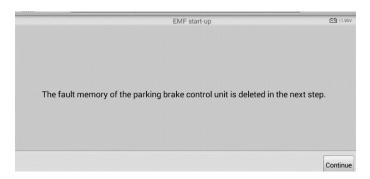


Figure 6-8 Sample EMF Start-up Screen 3

4) Follow the on-screen instructions to pull the parking brake button. Wait for appropriately three seconds until the parking brake is set. When the operation is successfully completed, a "Completed successfully" message will display on the screen, press **OK** to exit.

## **Parking Brake: Workshop Mode**

This service is used to activate and deactivate the installation position for the Automatic Hold brake. In this mode the parking brake is moved into the opened position and temporarily deactivated (personal protection).

The installation position must be activated for the following repairs:

- Replacement of brake pads.
- Replacement of a brake caliper.
- Replacement of an actuator.

Select **Parking Brake: Workshop Mode** and follow the on-screen instructions to perform a series of operations to initiate the brake pad after replacement.

When the operation is successfully completed, a "Completed successfully" message will appear on the screen. Press **OK** to exit.

# **Battery Management System (BMS) Service**

The Battery Management System (BMS) allows the scan tool to evaluate the battery charge state, monitor the close-circuit current, register the battery replacement, activate the rest state of the vehicle, and charge the battery via the diagnostic socket.

## NOTE

- This function is not supported by all vehicles. The screens shown in this section are examples.
- 2. The sub functions and actual test screens of the BMS may vary by vehicle, please follow the on-screen instructions to make correct option selection.

The vehicle may use either a sealed lead-acid battery or an AGM (Absorbed Glass Mat) battery. Lead acid battery contains liquid sulphuric acid and can spill when overturned. AGM battery (known as VRLA battery, valve regulated lead acid) also contains sulphuric acid, but the acid is contained in glass mats between terminal plates.

It is recommended that the replacement aftermarket battery has the same specifications, such as capacity and type, as the exiting battery. If the original battery is replaced with a different type of battery (e.g. a lead-acid battery is replaced with an AGM battery) or a battery with a different capacity (mAh), the vehicle may require reprogramming of the new battery type, in addition to, performing the battery reset. Consult the vehicle manual for additional vehicle-specific information.

#### **Register Battery Replacement**

This option displays the mileage reading of last battery was replaced, registers the battery replacement after replacing a new battery and informs the power management system that a new battery has been installed.

If the battery change is not registered, the power management system will not function properly, which may not provide the battery with enough charging power to operate the car or limit the functionality of vehicle's electrical systems.

Take **BMW** as an example.

#### To display the battery history

- 1. Tap the **Service** application button on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- Tap BMS button. The vehicle manufacturer selection screen displays. Tap VIN Scan or the vehicle manufacturer to acquire vehicle VIN information and tap Yes to confirm. See Vehicle Identification for details.
- Tap Register Battery Replacement in the EPB function list, the list may vary by test vehicle.

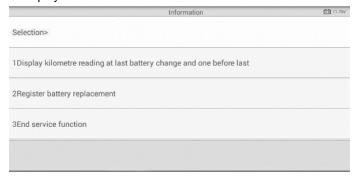


Figure 6-10 Sample BMS Screen 1

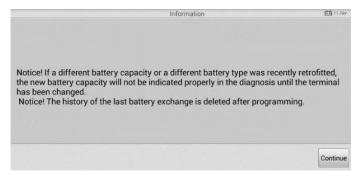


Figure 6-11 Sample BMS Screen 2

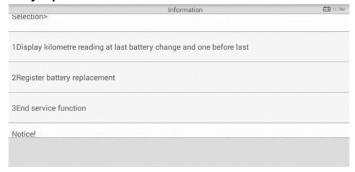


Figure 6-13 Sample BMS Screen 4

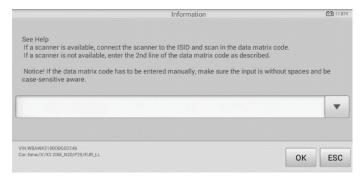


Figure 6-16 Sample BMS Screen 7

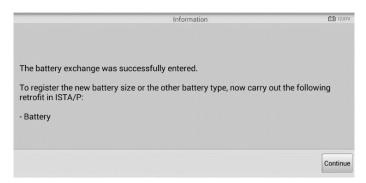


Figure 6-17 Sample BMS Screen 8

# Steering Angle Sensor (SAS) Service

Steering Angle Sensor Calibration permanently stores the current steering wheel position as the straight-ahead position in the steering angle sensor EEPROM. Therefore, the front wheels and the steering wheel must be set exactly to the straight-ahead position before calibration. In addition, the vehicle identification number (VIN) is also read from the instrument cluster and stored permanently in the steering angle sensor EEPROM. On successful completion of calibration, the steering angle sensor fault memory is automatically cleared.

Calibration must always be carried out after the following operations:

- Steering wheel replacement
- Steering angle sensor replacement
- Any maintenance that involves opening the connector hub from the steering angle sensor to the column
- Any maintenance or repair work on the steering linkage, steering gear or other related mechanism
- Wheel alignment or wheel track adjustment
- Accident repairs where damage to the steering angle sensor or assembly, or any part of the steering system may have occurred

#### NOTE

- Autel accepts no responsibility for any accident or injury arising from servicing the SAS system. When interpreting DTCs retrieved from the vehicle, always follow the manufacturer's recommendation for repair.
- All software screens shown in this manual are examples, actual test screens may vary by test vehicle. Pay attention to the menu titles and onscreen instructions to make correct option selections.
- 3. Before starting procedure, make sure vehicle has ESC. Look for button on dash.

#### Using a Land Rover as an example.

- 1. Tap the **Service** application button on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- Tap SAS button. The vehicle manufacturer selection screen displays. Tap VIN Scan
  or the vehicle manufacturer to acquire vehicle VIN information and tap Yes to confirm.
  See Vehicle Identification for details.

3. Tap the desired service in the SAS function list, the list may vary by test vehicle.

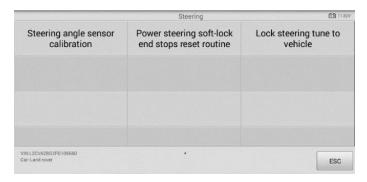


Figure 6-18 Sample SAS Function Menu

## **Steering Angle Sensor Calibration**

This function allows users to perform steering angle sensor calibration, clear records and clear counter. The function options vary by vehicle.

- Tap Steering Angle Sensor Calibration from the SAS function menu to enter the function screen.
- 2) Follow the on-screen instructions to set the ignition on/off as guided. The vehicle battery voltage signal should be in the range 12.5 13.5 volts to proceed with this service, otherwise the scan tablet will display a warning message.
- 3) Ensure the steering wheel is in the central position and the front wheels are in the straight position. Then tap **OK** to proceed.

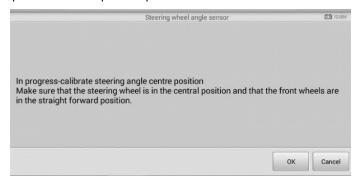


Figure 6-19 Sample SAS Function Screen 1

4) When the operation is finished, the scan tool will display a confirmation message. An error message will display if the procedure cannot be completed. Exit the diagnosis program, and solve the error before attempting SAS calibration again.

# Diesel Particle Filter (DPF) Service

The Diesel Particle Filter (DPF) function manages DPF regeneration, DPF component replacement teach-in and DPF teach-in after replacing the engine control unit.

The ECM monitors driving style and selects a suitable time to employ regeneration. Cars driven a lot at idling speed and low load will attempt to regenerate earlier than cars driven more with higher load and speed. In order for regeneration to take place, a prolonged high exhaust temperature must be obtained.

In the event of the car being driven in such a way that regeneration is not possible, i.e., frequent short journeys, a diagnostic trouble code will eventually be registered in addition to the DPF light and "Check Engine" indicators displaying. A service regeneration can be

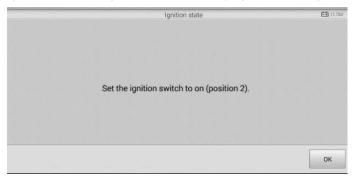


Figure 6-20 Sample SAS Function Screen 2

requested in the workshop using the diagnostic tool.

Before performing a forced DPF regeneration using the tool, check the following items:

- The fuel light is not on.
- No DPF-relevant faults are stored in system.
- The vehicle has the specified engine oil.
- The oil for diesel is not contaminated.

#### **IMPORTANT**

Before diagnosing a problem vehicle and attempting to perform an emergency regeneration, it is important to obtain a full diagnostic log and read out relevant measured value blocks.

## ✓ NOTE

 The DPF will not regenerate if the engine management light is on, or there is a faulty EGR valve.

- The ECU must be re-adapted when replacing the DPF and when topping up the fuel additive Eolys.
- 3. If the vehicle needs to be driven in order to perform a DPF service, a second person is needed for the function. One person should drive the vehicle while the other person observes the screen on the Tool. Do not attempt to drive and observe the scan tool at the same time. This is dangerous and puts your life and the lives of other motors and pedestrians at risk.

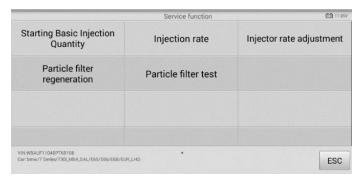


Figure 6-21 Sample DPF Service Function Menu

## **Starting Basic Inspection Quantity**

This function enables start fuel delivery matching.

- Tap Starting Basic Inspection Quantity from the service functions menu to enter the service screen.
- The tool communicates with the vehicle and reads the fault codes memory. Follow the on-screen instructions to finish this procedure.
- 3. The tool will display a function list menu as below. Press the corresponding number button to perform the desired function.

#### [3]/[4] Store Data and Exit

When the fuel delivery rate adjustment is completed, tap [3] to store the new value in the control units; or, select [4] and **OK** to retain the old value.

### Injection Rate

This function is used to adjust the injection volume.

- 1. Tap Injection Rate from the service functions menu to enter the service screen.
- 2. The tool communicates with the vehicle and reads the fault codes memory. Follow the on-screen instructions to finish this procedure.
- 3. The tool will display as below. Press the corresponding number button to perform the desired function.

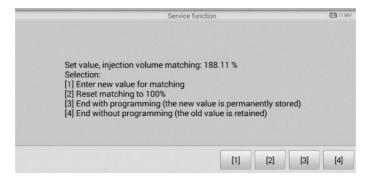


Figure 6-24 Sample Injection Rate Screen

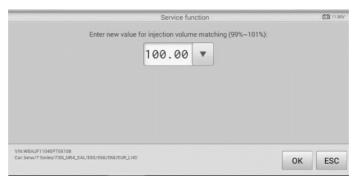


Figure 6-25 Sample Enter Value Screen

Once [2] is pressed, the tool will automatically reset the value to 100%.

#### [3]/[4] Store Data and Exit

When the injection volume adjustment is completed, select [3] and **OK** to store the new value in the control units; or, select [4] and **OK** to retain the old value.

## **Injector Rate Adjustment**

This function is used to adjust the injector rate for individual cylinders.

- 1. Tap **Injection rate adjustment** from the service functions menu.
- 2. The tool communicates with the vehicle and reads the fault codes memory. Follow the on-screen instructions to finish this procedure.
- 3. Tap the corresponding number button to enter a new value for each cylinder.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to tap on the corresponding number [1] [2] [3] [4] to enter the new value for the cylinder, restore the old value, and exit after finishing the function.

## **Particle Filter Regeneration**

This function is used to perform the particle filter regeneration.

- 1. Tap Particle filter regeneration on the service functions menu.
- The tool communicates with the vehicle and reads the fault codes memory. Follow the on-screen instructions to check the prerequisites before particle filter regeneration, such as the fuel, the time and driving style.

3. If the prerequisites are met, confirm to proceed as below. Tap **Request** to begin a regeneration or **End** to end the service function and exit.

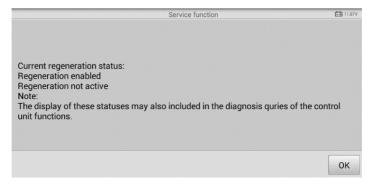


Figure 6-27 Sample Regeneration Status Screen

#### NOTE

If a particle filter is heavily loaded with soot, the regeneration request can be blocked again after a short time or is not released. Drive the vehicle for appropriately 30 minutes at a constant speed. Then perform the Particle filter regeneration service again.

During the regeneration phase and with the engine running, it can also occur that the display for "Regeneration active" jumps to "Regeneration not active". This behavior can be seen exclusively with the vehicle stationary with the engine.

#### **Particle Filter Test**

It is advisable to carry out a series of particle filter tests as a result of constant DPF regeneration, such as checking oil level, oil change interval for diesel contamination, swirl flaps, backpressure sensors and particle filter soot remains.

- Tap Particle filter test from the service functions menu.
- The tool communicates with the vehicle and reads the fault codes memory. If there is no relevant fault code stored in DDE, the screen displays as below. Select Cancel to exit this function.
- 3. If there are DPF-related codes stored in DDE, the screen displays as below. Select **OK** to continue or **Cancel** to exit this function.

# Immobilizer (IMMO) Service

An immobilizer is an anti-theft mechanism that prevents an automobile's engine from starting unless the correct ignition key or other device is present. This device prevents thieves from starting the car by a method known as hot wiring. Most new vehicles have an immobilizer as standard equipment. An important advantage of this system is that it doesn't require the car owner to activate it; it operates automatically. An immobilizer is considered as providing much more effective anti-theft protection than an audible alarm alone; many auto insurance companies offer lower rates for vehicles that are equipped with an immobilizer.

As an anti-theft device, an immobilizer disables one of the systems needed to start a car's engine, usually the fuel supply or the ignition. This is accomplished by radio frequency identification between a transponder in the ignition key and a device called a radio frequency reader in the steering column. When the key is placed in the ignition, the transponder sends a signal with a unique identification code to the reader, which relays it to a receiver in the vehicle's computer control module. If the code is correct, the computer allows the fuel supply and ignition systems to operate and start the car. If the code is incorrect or absent, the computer disables the system, and the car will be unable to start until the correct key is placed in the ignition.

The IMMO service can disable a lost vehicle key and program the replacement key fob. One or more replacement key fobs can be programmed.

#### To program the replacement key fob(s)

- Tap IMMO KEYS after entering the Service function from the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap **Automatic Selection** or **Manual Selection** to acquire vehicle VIN information and tap **Yes** to confirm. See *Vehicle Identification* for details.
- 3. Tap **Erase/Program all key fobs** in the IMMO function list once displayed, the list may vary by test vehicle.

## **⊘** NOTE

- 1. To complete key fob programming, the Security Code will be required. This can be done through the Security Code Read function in hot functions.
- 2. Before programming, please check and erase the fault codes.

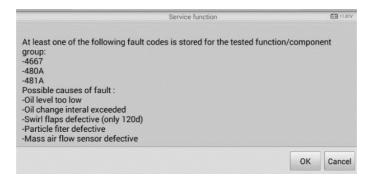


Figure 6-30 Sample IMMO Note Screen

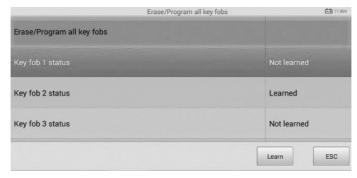


Figure 6-31 Sample Program Key FOB Screen

# 7. Battery Test

The MaxiBAS BT506 is a battery and electrical system analysis tool that uses Adaptive Conductance, an advanced battery analysis method to produce a more accurate examination of the battery's cold cranking ability and reserve capacity, which is vital to determining a battery's true health. The MaxiBAS BT506 enables technicians to view the health status of the vehicle's battery and electrical system. Together with the MaxiBAS BT506, this application can complete battery & starter and alternator system tests.

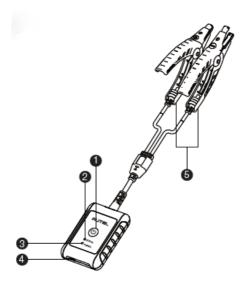


Figure 7-1 MaxiBAS BT506 Tester

# **Test Preparation**

## Inspect the Battery

Before starting a test, observe the battery for:

- Cracking, buckling or leaking (If you see any of these defects, replace the battery.)
- Corroded, loose or damaged cables and connections (Repair or replace as needed.)
- Corrosion on the battery terminals, and dirt or acid on the case top (Clean the case and terminals using a wire brush and a mixture of water and baking soda.)

## **Connect the Battery Tester**

#### To pair the BT506 with the MaxiPRO tablet

- Press and hold the **Power** Button to turn on both MaxiPRO tablet and BT506.
   Ensure that the unit is sufficiently charged before using.
- Enable Bluetooth on the MaxiPRO tablet by tapping VCI Manager > BAS BT, and the tablet automatically scans for an available tester for Bluetooth pairing. The device name will appear as "Maxi" suffixed with the device serial number.

- 3. Check the serial number of your BT506 series tester and select the desired device for pairing.
- 4. When paired successfully, the connection status will read as "Connected" and the Status LED will flash blue.

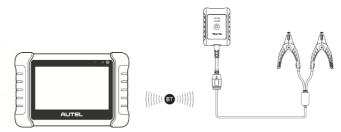


Figure 7-2 Connecting with the Tablet

Connect the red clamp to the positive (+) terminal and the black clamp to the negative (-) terminal of the battery.

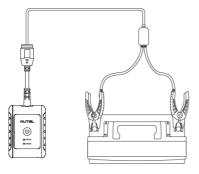


Figure 7-3 Connecting to a Battery

## In-vehicle Test

In-vehicle Test is used for testing batteries that are installed in a vehicle. An in-vehicle test includes Battery Test, Starter Test, and Generator Test. These tests help determine the health status of the battery, the starter, and the generator.

#### IMPORTANT

Before using the diagnostic functions, download the desired vehicle software on the Update screen.

#### NOTE

The complete in-vehicle test includes battery test, starter test and generator test, in sequence.

#### Confirm Vehicle Information

1. Tap In-vehicle Test.

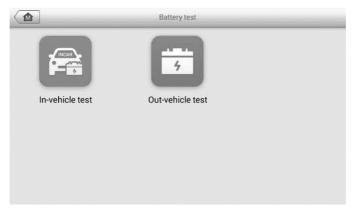


Figure 7-4 Battery Test Screen

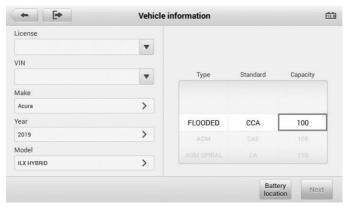


Figure 7-5 Sample Vehicle Information Screen

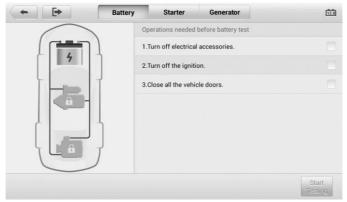


Figure 7-6 Sample Battery Screen

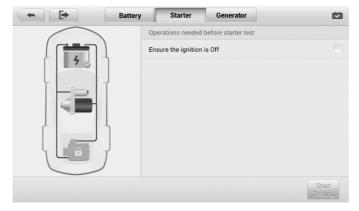


Figure 7-8 Sample Starter Screen

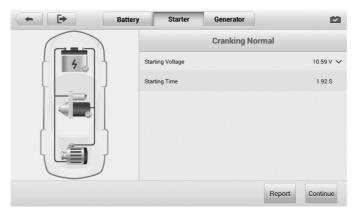


Figure 7-9 Sample Starter Test Results Screen

## **Out-vehicle Test**

Out-vehicle Test is used to test the conditions of batteries that are not connected to a vehicle. This function aims to check the health status of the battery only.

#### **Test Procedure**

- > To start the out-vehicle test
  - 1. Tap Out-vehicle Test.
  - 2. Connect the tester clamps to the battery terminals.
  - 3. Select the appropriate battery type, rating standard, and CCA value. Tap **Start Testing** to start the test.

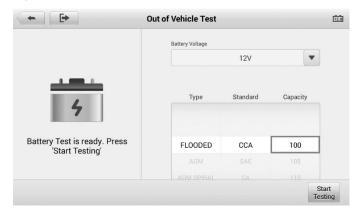


Figure 7-11 Sample Out-vehicle Test Screen

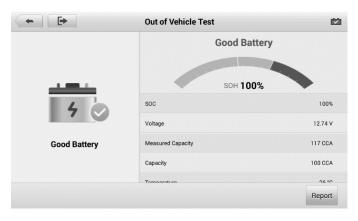


Figure 7-12 Sample Out-vehicle Test Results Screen

# 8. MaxiFix

The MaxiFix application launches the on-line troubleshooter database, which not only provides all common diagnostic trouble codes (DTCs) for most vehicles, but also serves as a forum allowing for technicians to network with other MaxiPRO users, and gives users access to a vast database of repair and diagnostic tips along with proven tips.

The MaxiFix database keeps growing with daily troubleshooting resources and advisory reports from MaxiPRO users from all over the world.

Information in the MaxiFix database is organized into a series of diagnostic tips that are designed to quickly lead to the root cause of a particular problem on the test vehicle.

## **Navigation**

You need to register the device to your online account before launching the MaxiFix platform, see *Product Registration* for details.

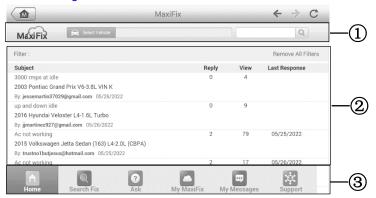


Figure 8-1 Sample MaxiFix Home Screen

The MaxiFix screen layout consists of three main areas:

- 1. The Header the tool bar across the top of the screen which allows you to select vehicles and perform searches.
- The Main Screen located at the center of the screen displaying content based on the vehicle attributes and keywords specified. The tabs on the main screen vary in accordance with the section chosen on the Navigation Menu, allowing you to switch between functions.
- The Navigation Menu the main menu at the bottom of the screen that provides access to different sections of MaxiFix.

#### The Header

The Header at the top of the screen features:

- A Select Vehicle button to open the vehicle identification window, and vehicle information bar, for example "2014 > Hyundai > Accord Coupe > L4-2.4L (K24W1)".
- A search field to find relevant information by entering keywords, codes, or problems.

#### **Select Vehicle Button**

The "Select Vehicle" button on the Header allows you to specify the vehicle that you want to research on MaxiFix, by selecting each of the vehicle attributes from a sequence of option lists. This feature helps to filter out the searches that allow only the information that applies to the identified vehicle to display.

#### **⊘** NOTE

All attributes must be specified to make a complete vehicle selection for the most efficient search.

#### > To select a vehicle

- 1. Click the **Select Vehicle** button on the Header.
- 2. Select the year of the vehicle from the list.
- Select the manufacturer of the vehicle from the list.
- 4. Select the model of the vehicle from the list.
- 5. Select the submodel of the vehicle from the list.
- 6. Select the engine of the vehicle from the list.

After completing the vehicle selection procedure, the selected vehicle is shown on the Header.

## **Terminology**

#### MaxiFix Tip

A MaxiFix Tip offers a detailed outline of an actual vehicle repair. Combined with proven results and vehicle specific data, this all-in-one information source provides quick and easy repair solutions.

On MaxiFix community you can find Tips or share your own Tip to help other community.

#### To search for a MaxiFix Tip

- Select a Vehicle:
  - a) Click **Select Vehicle** on the Header at the top of the page.
  - b) Select the year of the vehicle from the list.
  - c) Select the **manufacturer** of the vehicle from the list.
  - d) Select the **model** of the vehicle from the list.

- e) Select the **submodel** of the vehicle from the list.
- f) Select the **engine** of the vehicle from the list.

After completing the vehicle selection procedure, the chosen vehicle is shown on the Header.

#### Enter a Search Term.

MaxiFix has an exclusive one-stop lookup that helps you find all of MaxiFix resources with one click. Input a search term into the search bar on the Header to begin the search.

#### Proven Results.

The powerful MaxiFix database gives you proven results. The typical MaxiFix Tips combine actual workshop fixes and vehicle repair data that include:

- a) OBDII Fault Codes description and reference helps in diagnostic assessment by making clear the nature of an automotive problem so that beginner and advanced technicians can make effective repairs.
- b) Real Fix Tips provides repair tips from actual shop practices and are presented in an easy-to-understand Complaint, Cause and Correction format.

If you are unable to find the information relating to your specific problem, you can pose a question to the MaxiFix community by clicking "Ask" on the Navigation Menu at the bottom of the screen.

#### Adopted!

The "Adopted!" icon displays at the top right side of a Tip screen when at least one technician has "adopted" or recommended the tip. If a tip has helped you to solve a repair problem, you are encouraged to give an Adopted! count to the tip. Each member is allowed to click "Adopted!" The "Adopted!" count identify the tips that are really helpful. As reference to other members, you can also post a comment about how the tip has helped you.

## **Operations**

The Navigation Menu is at the bottom of the screen. Selecting the items on the Navigation Menu allows you to switch between the main sections on MaxiFix. These main sections include:

- Home displays all questions and allows you to specify questions about one or multiple manufacturer vehicles.
- Search Fix allows you to search for information from all available resources on MaxiFix, including: Open Questions, Tips, and Real Fixes, and displays search results.
- Ask allows you to ask a question in the community.
- My MaxiFix displays all your posts including Questions and Fixes in the community, and allows you to view your personal profile, select your vehicle

- preference, and share your tips.
- My Messages displays a list of message notifications that are relevant to your activities in the Question section.
- Support opens the FAQ page, or a message box for contacting Customer Service by email.

#### Home

Home is the first option on the Navigation Menu at the bottom of the screen. Tap to open your MaxiFix home page. There is a list of questions posted on the community. Scroll down the screen to view more questions by tapping "View More". Click on any question and you will be directed to the detailed screen in the Ask section.

Click the "Filter" button on the main screen of Home, and select the vehicle manufacturers that you are interested in. This filter can be canceled anytime by clicking the "Remove All Filters" button, and the default setting will be restored to display questions about all vehicle makes.

#### Search Fix Features

Search Fix, the second option on the Navigation Menu at the bottom of the screen, presents search results for the specified vehicle. Search results are listed in various categories:

- All includes all search results, including related Questions, Tips, and Real Fixes to your search.
- Questions presents a list of open Question discussed in the community that may be pertinent to your search.
- Tips presents a list of Tips that directly correlate to your search criteria. Select a
  Tip from the list to open and review the complete Tip.
- Real Fixes presents a list of Tips that have been collected from actual shop repair orders and are presented in an easy-to-understand Complaint, Cause, and Correction format.

#### Ask

Ask, the third option on the Navigation Menu at the bottom of the screen, allows you to ask a question about a particular vehicle repair issue in the community.

#### To ask a MaxiFix Question

- 1. Click **Select Vehicle** on the Header to specify the vehicle you are asking about.
- Click Ask on the Navigation Menu at the bottom of the screen to open the Ask page.
- 3. On the **Ask** screen find **Ask for Help** and complete the section to ask a question.

The Ask screen has four sections:

- Subject enter a brief subject for the question.
- My Question asks a clear and concise question that you want to ask the community. Be sure to be descriptive and concise when asking your question.
- Problem Description describes how the vehicle is behaving.
- Repair History includes any previous diagnostic tests that you performed, including the results of the tests. Also list any parts that were replaced during previous diagnostic work.

Tap **Cancel** to cancel your question and return to the Ask page.

Tap **Submit** to post your question to the community.

Tap **Attach File** to include images or reference files with your question.

Select one answer from the responses and then close the question. For details, please refer to *My Messages*.

## My MaxiFix

My MaxiFix, the fourth option on the Navigation Menu at the bottom of the screen, opens your personal MaxiFix page. To access the features on My MaxiFix screen you can select from the following tabs:

- My Questions opens a list with links to the opened questions that you have posted to the community.
- My Cases opens a list with links to the closed questions and tips that you have contributed to the community.
- Marked Posts opens a list with links to Tips and discussions that you are actively participating in.
- My Profile allows you to view your Autel account information including: your Autel ID, personal information, MaxiFix score, phone number and register time, and add an avatar image.
- Vehicle Preference used to set up a list of preferred vehicles. The preferred list allows you to limit the choices that display on the "Select Vehicle" list to specific years and makes. Click "Set Year" or "Set Make" to set your preferred models. The preferred makes will also be displayed in the "Filter" options on the Home page.
- Share a Tip allows you to share your personal repair experience with the community.

Click **My MaxiFix** on the Navigation Menu at the bottom of the screen, to display all questions and tips that you have contributed to the community.

#### Create a Tip

A "Tip" is a concise and complete description of the fix for a particular vehicle repair issue.

#### > To create a new MaxiFix Tip

- 1. Select My MaxiFix on the Navigation Menu.
- 2. Select **Select Vehicle** from the Header and enter the identifying attributes of the vehicle you are writing the Tip about.
- On the My MaxiFix screen find Share a Tip; click this link to open the My Tips page.
- 4. Enter the Tip subject in the **Subject** field.
- Compose your Tip in the **Description** field. Include as much information as possible, while keeping the information concise. A Tip should provide accurate information that is reader-friendly.

Use the **Cancel** button at the bottom right of the screen to cancel creating a tip and return to the My MaxiFix page. Or,

Use the Submit button at the bottom right of the screen to add your tip to the community.

Use the **Attach File** button at the bottom left of the screen to include images or other supporting data with your question.

#### View Profile Information

You can view or edit your personal profile by clicking on your account ID or "My Profile" in My MaxiFix section. View the profiles of other community members by clicking their portrait. Information included in your profile determines how you are presented to the community, and what type of information will be sent to you from the community.

## My Messages

My Messages, the fifth option on the Navigation Menu at the bottom of the screen, shows a list of message notification that are relevant to your activities in the Question section. A notification icon will appear on the top-right corner of "My Messages" if there is any new or unread message in the Question section. The number on the notification icon indicates the total number of the new and unread messages. The message notification will appear under the following two conditions:

- 1. A MaxiFix community member has replied to your question or answer.
- 2. A MaxiFix community member has "Adopted!" one of your answers.

Tap **My Messages**, select and open a message from the list. If your problem is solved, you should select one Adopted Answer" and close the question. If your answer is marked as "Adopted!", "Adopted! + 4" will be displayed permanently.

Tap **Clear** to delete all message notifications.

#### Select "Adopted Answers"

Members should select one Adopted Answer from responses on "My Messages" screen before closing a question. Community members who provide the "Adopted Answer" are rewarded with scores for their contribution.

#### About Adopted Answer:

- Only one answer can be selected as "Adopted Answer".
- Only the MaxiFix member who asked the guestion can rate the "Answer".

#### Close a Question

When a repair question that you've posted to the community is resolved, you are encouraged to comment on the resolution as a way to share good information with the community. This will help the other MaxiFix members.

To close a question, you need to select the question's response message from the message list on "My Messages" screen first, then tap "Adopted Answer" and select "Close Question". Tap the "Cancel" button to cancel your submission and return to My Messages page. It is strongly recommended that you share your repair solutions before closing a question. Your question will be converted to a MaxiFix Community Tip after closing.

### Score Rewarding System

- 1. A score of 4 is awarded if your answer is selected as the "Adopted Answer".
- 2. A score of 3 is awarded when you close a question.
- 3. A score of 2 is awarded if your closed question is marked as "Adopted!" by no less than 20 community members.
- 4. A score of 1 is awarded if your answer is selected as the "Adopted Answer" for a closed question that is marked as "Adopted!" by no less than 20 community members.
- 5. A score of 1 is awarded to each of the first three respondents.

## **Support**

Support, the last option on the Navigation Menu at the bottom of the screen, opens a screen that provides two ways to gain support from MaxiFix:

- 1. A message form to contact the MaxiFix administrator.
- 2. Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) section that answers the community's most frequently asked questions.

If you wish to contact the administrator of this site please use the contact form. Select "Support" from the Navigation Menu to open the comment window. To allow the administrator to respond to your question or issue, the following information should be provided:

- Your name
- A contact email address
- A contact phone number

# 9. Shop Manager

The **Shop Manager** application manages the workshop information including customer information records and test vehicle history records. There are three main functions available:

- Vehicle History
- Workshop Information
- Customer Manager

The operations of these functions of the Shop Manager application are controlled by the toolbar buttons, which are listed and described in the table below:

## **Vehicle History**

This function stores test vehicle history records, including vehicle information and the retrieved DTCs from previous diagnostic sessions. All information is displayed in summarized details. Tap on a record to resume a diagnostic session on a "stored vehicle".

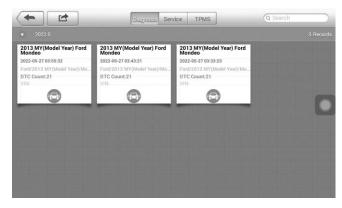


Figure 9-1 Sample Vehicle History Screen

- > To activate a test session for the recorded vehicle
  - 1. Tap the **Shop Manager** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
  - 2. Tap Vehicle History.
  - Tap the **Diagnostics** button at the bottom of the thumbnail of a vehicle record item.
  - 4. Or, tap the vehicle record thumbnail to view record.
  - 5. A Historical Test record displays, check the recorded information of the test vehicle, and tap the Diagnostics button on the upper right corner.
  - 6. The vehicle's Diagnostics screen displays a new diagnostic session, see *Diagnosis* for detailed instructions on vehicle diagnostic operations.

## **Historical Test Record**

The Historical Test record sheet is a detailed data form that includes general vehicle information such as vehicle year, make and model. The form also includes retrieved DTC from previous test and all information manually inputted by the technician.

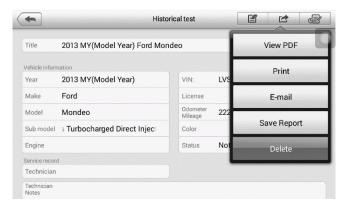


Figure 9-2 Sample Historical Test Record Sheet

#### To edit the Historical Test record sheet

- 1. Tap the **Shop Manager** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap Vehicle History.
- Select the specific vehicle history record thumbnail from the main section. The Historical Test record sheet displays.
- 4. Tap the **Edit** button to start editing.
- Tap on each item to input the corresponding information or add relevant files or images.

## NOTE

The vehicle VIN number, or license and the customer information account are correlated by default.

- 6. Tap **Add to Customer** to supplement the Historical Test record sheet to an existing customer account, or add a new associated account with the test vehicle record. See *Customer Manager* for more information.
- 7. Tap **Done** to save the updated record sheet, or tap **Cancel** to exit without saving.

## **Workshop Information**

Use the Workshop Information form to edit, input and save the detailed workshop information, such as shop name, address, phone number and other remarks, which when printing vehicle diagnostic reports and other associated test file, will display as the header of the printed documents.

#### To edit the Workshop Information sheet

- Tap the Shop Manager application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap Workshop Information.
- Tap the Edit button on the top toolbar.
- 4. Tap on each field to input the appropriate information.
- Tap **Done** to save the updated workshop information sheet, or tap **Cancel** to exit without saving.

## **Customer Manager**

Use the Customer Manager function to create and edit customer accounts and correlate with the associated test vehicle history records.

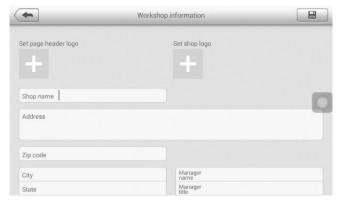


Figure 9-3 Sample Workshop Information Sheet

#### To create a customer account

- 1. Tap the **Shop Manager** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap Customer Manager.
- 3. Tap the **Add Account** button. An empty information form displays, tap each field to input the appropriate information.

## **⊘** NOTE

Required fields are noted.

4. Tap the + photo frame beside the Name chart to add a photo. A sub menu

- displays, select **Take Photo** to take a new photo for the account, or select **Choose Photo** to choose from an existing image.
- 5. If a customer adds or changes vehicles, tap **Add New Vehicle Information**, and input the vehicle information. Tap the ② button to cancel.
- 6. Tap **Done** to save the account, or tap **Cancel** to exit without saving.

#### > To edit a customer account

- 1. Tap the **Shop Manager** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap Customer Manager.
- Select a customer account by tapping the corresponding name card. A Customer Information sheet displays.
- 4. Tap the **Edit** button on the top toolbar to start editing.
- 5. Tap on the input field that needs to be altered or supplemented, and enter updated information.
- 6. Tap **Done** to save the updated information, or tap **Cancel** to exit without saving.

#### To delete a customer account

- 1. Tap the **Shop Manager** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap Customer Manager.
- 3. Select a customer account by tapping the corresponding name card. A Customer Information sheet displays.
- 4. Tap the **Edit** button on the top toolbar to start editing.
- Tap the **Delete Customer Information** button. A confirmation message displays.
- 6. Tap **OK** to confirm the deletion, or tap **Cancel** to cancel the request.

## 10. Data Manager

The **Data Manager** application is used to store, print, and review the saved files. Most operations are controlled through the toolbar.

Selecting the Data Manager application opens the file system menu. Different file types are sorted separately under different options, there are five types of information files to be viewed or played back.

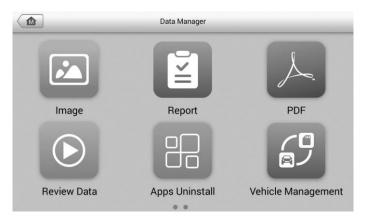


Figure 10-1 Sample Data Manager Main Screen

## **Image**

The Image section contains all captured screenshot images.

- 2. Main Section displays the stored images.

#### > To edit image information

- 1. Tap the **Data Manager** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap **Image** to access the image database.
- 3. Select an image to display in full screen.
- 4. Tap the screen once to display the editing toolbar.
- 5. Tap the **Info** button to display the image information.
- Tap the Edit button on the top right corner of the window. The editing screen displays.
- 7. Edit the image information by entering the new file name, and file information.
- 8. Tap **Done** to save the information and exit, or tap **Cancel** to exit without saving.

#### To delete selected images

- 1. Tap the **Data Manager** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap **Image** to access the image database.
- 3. Tap the image to display the editing toolbar.
- Tap the **Delete** button, and then tap **Delete image**. The selected images will be deleted.

## Report

The Report section stores diagnostics information of the vehicle and forms a diagnostics report for user to share.

## > To share a report

- 1. Tap the **Data Manager** application from the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap Report to access the Report List screen.
- 3. Tap a report record to display the Report sharing dialog box.

- 4. Tap **View local reports** to display it in full screen.
- 5. Return to the Report List screen, tap the report and tap **Report cloud sharing**.

6. Scan the QR code or tap **Send Email** or **Send SMS** to share the report.

### **PDF**

The PDF section stores and displays all saved data PDF files. Select a PDF from the database to display.

The standard Adobe Reader application is used for file viewing and editing, please refer to the associated Adobe Reader manual for detailed instructions.

## **Review Data**

The Review Data section allows playback of the recorded data frames of live data streams.

On the Review Data main screen, select a record file to playback.

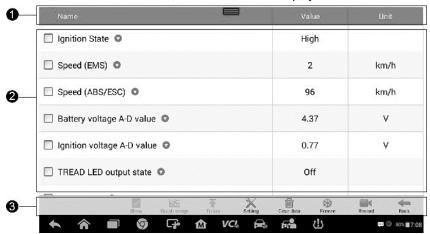


Figure 10-6 Sample Data Playback Screen

- Drop-down Toolbar tap the button at the top center of the screen to open the Drop-down Toolbar.
- 2. Main Section displays the recorded data frames.
- 3. Navigation Toolbar controls data playback.

Use the Navigation Toolbar buttons to playback the record data from frame to frame.

Tap Back to exit data playback.

## **Apps Uninstall**

Manage the firmware applications installed on the MaxiPRO Diagnostics System. Select this to open a management screen, on which all the available vehicle diagnostic applications can be reviewed.

Tap the vehicle firmware you want to delete, a blue check mark at the upper right corner of the firmware will display. Tap the **Delete** button on the top bar and tap **OK** to delete the firmware from the system database.

## **Vehicle Management**

The Vehicle Management section allows you to transfer the vehicle data to an external memory card to save memories of the tablet.

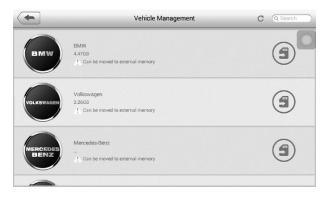


Figure 10-7 Sample Vehicle Management Screen

## **Data Logging**

Data Logging allows you to launch Support platform directly to view all records of all sent or unsent (saved) data logs on the diagnostic system. For more details, please refer to *Data Logging*.

## 11. Settings

Tap the Settings button to adjust the default settings and view information about the MaxiPRO system:

- Unit
- Language
- Printing Settings
- Report Settings
- Multitask
- TPMS Market
- TPS Prog. Setting
- Auto Update
- Car Order
- System Settings
- About

This section describes the procedures to adjust the device's system settings.

## Unit

This option allows you to adjust the measurement unit for the diagnostic system.

### To adjust the unit setting

- 1. Tap the **Settings** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap the **Unit** option on the left column.
- Select the desired measurement unit, Metric or Imperial. A check mark will display to the right of the selected unit.
- 4. Tap the **Home** button on the top left corner to return to the MaxiPRO Job Menu. Or tap another setting to adjust.

## Language

Select the appropriate display language for the MaxiPRO system.

## > To adjust the language setting

- 1. Tap the **Settings** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap the Language option on the left column.
- 3. Select the required language. A check will display to the right of the selected language.

4. Tap the **Home** button on the top-left corner to return to the MaxiPRO Job Menu. Or tap another setting to adjust.

## **Printing Settings**

This option allows you to print any data or information through a PC via Wi-Fi connection.

#### > To set up the printer connection

- 1. Tap the **Settings** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap the **Printing Settings** option on the left column.
- 3. Tap the **Print via Network** to activate the printing function, enabling the device to send files to the printer through the networked PC via Wi-Fi connection.
- 4. Tap the **Home** button on the top-left corner to return to the MaxiPRO Job Menu, or tap another setting to adjust.

#### To install the printer driver program to a PC

- Download the Maxi PC Suite from <u>www.autel.com</u> > Support > Downloads > Diagnostic Tool and install to your PC.
- 2. Double click the setup.exe file.
- 3. Select the installation language and the wizard will load momentarily.
- 4. Follow the instructions on the screen and click **Next** to continue.
- 5. Click **Install**. The printer driver program will be installed onto the PC.
- 6. Click **Finish** to complete the installation.

## **⊘** NOTE

The PC and the tablet must be connected to the same network.

## > To print via a PC

- 1. Launch the PC Link application on the PC.
- 2. Click Test Print to make sure the printer is working successfully.
- 3. Tap the Print button on the toolbar of the tablet. A test file will be sent to the PC.
  - If the Auto Print option on the MaxiSys Printer tab is selected, the received file is automatically printed.
  - If the **Auto Print** option is not selected, click **Open PDF File** to view files. Select the file(s) to print and click **Print**.

## **Report Settings**

This option automatically synchronizes the diagnostics information of the vehicle to the vehicle history and forms a diagnostics report for user to upload. Tap the **ON/OFF** button to enable/disable the **Report Upload to Cloud** function. The button displays blue if the function is enabled and displays gray if the function is disabled.

## **Multitask**

The Multitask option allows you to turn the Multitask function on or off. The Multitask feature enables you to browse and navigate more freely among different applications on the MaxiPRO system. Tap the **Multitask** button, the Multitask menu displays all active applications.

#### > To enable the Multitask function

- 1. Tap the **Settings** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap the Multitask option on the left column.
- 3. Tap the **ON/OFF** button to enable or disable the Multitask function. If the function is enabled the button displays blue, or if disabled the button displays gray.
- 4. Tap the **Home** button on the top left corner to return to the MaxiPRO Job Menu. Or select another setting option for the system setup.

## **TPMS Market**

This option allows you to set the TPMS market region. The available options are **Europe Market**, **North America Market**, **Korea Market**, **Japan Market**, and **Australia Market**. A check mark will display to the right of the selected item.

## **TPS Prog. Setting**

This option allows you to set the TPS program pressure limit. The available options are **Prog. Pressure ≤ 69Kpa/10PSI** and **No Prog. Pressure Limit.** A check mark will display to the right of the selected item.

## **Auto Update**

The Auto Update allows the tool to automatically update the OS, the MaxiPRO system, and the Vehicle coverage software. Each can be configured to update automatically and at specified times. Tap the **ON** button and set the desired automatic update time.

### To enable the auto update

- 1. Tap the **Settings** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- Tap the Auto Update option on the left column. The three auto update items display on the right.
- 3. Select the update type to schedule. Toggle the button to ON.
- To set download time, use the + and buttons or tap on the numbers and the manual input screen will display. Tap **Done** to complete the time setting.

## ✓ NOTE

The tool must be connected to the Internet at the time download is scheduled.

## Car Order

This option allows you to sort the vehicles either by alphabetical order or by frequency of use.

#### > To adjust the vehicle list setting

- 1. Tap **Settings** on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap Car order on the left column.
- 3. Select the desired sort type. A check mark will display to the right of the selected item
- 4. Tap the **Home** icon on the top-left corner to return to the MaxiPRO Job Menu, or select another setting option for the system setup.

## System Settings

Access the Android system setting inter face to adjust background system settings including wireless and network settings, sound and display screen settings and system security settings.

#### To enable the App Switcher function

- 1. Tap the **Settings** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap the **System settings** option on the left column.
- 3. Tap the **App Switcher** option on the left column.
- 4. Check the box beside "Always show the App Switcher" on the right side of the screen, then the App Switcher icon will display.

Short press the **App Switcher** icon opens a control panel:

- Tap a specific app shortcut button to access selected application screen.
- Long press a specific app shortcut button to display the app menu. The shortcut can be altered here.
- Press and drag the App Switcher icon to alter the icons position on the screen.

Refer to the Android documentation for additional information on Android system settings.

## **About**

About displays information regarding the MaxiPRO diagnostic device including the product name, version, hardware, and the device's serial number.

### > To check the MaxiPRO product information in About

- 1. Tap the **Settings** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- 2. Tap **About** on the left column. The product information screen displays on the right.
- 3. Tap **Home** on the top left corner to return to the MaxiPRO Job Menu, or select another setting to adjust.

## 12. Update

This chapter describes the update operation for both the MP808TS tablet and the MaxiVCI Mini. The software and firmware updates of the tablet can be completed on the tablet via the Internet, while the updates for MaxiVCI Mini can be completed either by connecting to a tablet or by connecting with a PC.

## **Tablet Update**

The Update application on the tablet downloads the latest released software. The updates improve the MaxiPRO applications' capabilities, typically by adding new tests, new vehicle coverage and/or by adding enhanced database applications.

## **Update Operation**

When connected to Internet, the tablet automatically searches for available updates. Updates can be downloaded and installed on the device. This section describes update procedures in the MaxiPRO system.

- 1. Navigation and Controls
  - Home Button returns to the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
  - Refresh refreshes the available update list.
  - Diagnosis Tab displays all available vehicle diagnostic software.
  - TPMS Tab displays all available TPMS service software for vehicles.
  - Renew renews the subscription.

 Search Bar — search specific update item by inputting the file name. Example: enter a vehicle manufacturer.

#### 2. Status Bar

- Left Side displays your account email address and expiration date of your subscription.
- Right Side shows the remaining days of your subscription and real-time Internet speed amid downloading.

#### 3. Main Section

- Left Column displays vehicle buttons and update software version; tap the About button to display a function list with additional software update details.
- Middle Column displays a brief introduction about the new changes to the software operation or capabilities. Tap 
   button to open an information screen to view more details, and tap the dim area around to close the window.
- Right Column according to the operation status of each software item, the button displays differently.
  - ♦ Tap the sort type button to sort available items in desired type.
  - ♦ Tap Bulk update to batch update selected items.
  - ♦ Tap Get to update the item.
  - ♦ Tap Pause to suspend the update.
  - → Tap Continue to resume the update.

## > To update the diagnostic software and TPMS service software

- Ensure the tablet is connected to a power source and has a stable connection with the Internet.
- 2. Tap the **Update** application button on the MaxiPRO Job Menu; or tap the received notification message; or tap the Update icon on the Vehicle Menu in Diagnostics application. The Update application screen displays.
- 3. Check all available updates and select the desired tab:
  - If you decide to update all the items, tap **Bulk update** > **Select all**.
  - If you decided to update more than one item, tap the Bulk update button and selected the desired items.
  - If you only want to update one item, tap the Get button on the right column
    of the item.
- 4. Tap the **Pause** button to suspend the updating process. Tap **Continue** to resume updating and the process will resume from the break point.
- 5. When the updating process is completed, the firmware will be installed automatically. The previous version will be replaced.

There is NO separate download button for the tablet's firmware. The firmware is downloaded with the software package.

An update firmware message will display to remind you to install the firmware when a vehicle manufacturer is chosen in the TPMS menu.

## **MaxiVCI Mini Update**

## **Update via Tablet**

Before updating the VCI software, ensure the tablet's network connection to the Internet is stable.

#### > To update the MaxiVCI Mini software

- Power on the tablet.
- 2. Connect the MaxiVCI Mini to the tablet via USB.
- 3. Tap the VCI Manager application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu of the tablet.
- 4. Select VCI Update from the connection mode list.
- 5. The current version and the latest version of the VCI software will be display, click **Update Now** to update the VCI software if an update is available.

## **Update via PC**

#### > To update via PC

- Download the Maxi PC Suite from <u>www.autel.com</u> > Support > Downloads > Diagnostic Tools, and install it onto your windows-PC.
- 2. Connect the MaxiVCI Mini to a PC using a USB cable.
- 3. Launch the PC Suite on the PC which is installed after the installation of Maxi PC Suite and click **MaxiVCI Mini** icon in the Device Selection window.
- 4. The PC will automatically recognize the MaxiVCI Mini.
- 5. Click **Update** to complete the update if an update is available

## 13. VCI Manager

This application pairs the tablet with the MaxiVCI Mini, checks the communication status, and update the VCI and BAS firmware.

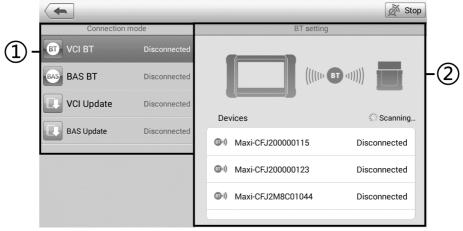


Figure 13-1 Sample VCI Manager Screen

- ① Connection Mode there are four connection modes available for selection. The connection state is displayed alongside.
- VCI BT when paired to a VCI via Bluetooth, the connection state displays as Connected; otherwise it displays as Disconnected.

#### > To pair the VCI with the tablet via Bluetooth

- Power on the tablet.
- 2. Connect the MaxiPRO Diagnostics Platform to the vehicle through the VCI.
- 3. Tap **VCI Manager** on the MaxiPRO Job Menu of the tablet.
- Tap VCI BT from the connection mode list.
- 5. Toggle Bluetooth **ON**. The device will start searching for available units for pairing.
- 6. Depending on the VCI you use, the device name may appear as "Maxi" suffixed with the serial number. Select the appropriate device for pairing.
- 7. When paired successfully, the connection status reads as Connected.
- 8. After a few seconds, the VCI button on the system Navigation Bar at the bottom of the screen will display a green badge, indicating that the tablet is connected to the VCI.
- 9. To disconnect the device, tap the connected device again.

10. Tap Back icon on the top-left to return to the MaxiPRO Job Menu.

## **⊘** NOTE

A VCI can be paired with only one tablet at a time, and once it's been paired, the device will not be discovered by any other unit.

- BAS BT when paired to a battery tester via Bluetooth, the connection state displays as Connected; Otherwise it displays as Disconnected. For details, see Connect the Battery Tester.
- VCI Update updates VCI firmware via the Internet through the MaxiPRO tablet networking using USB connection.

#### > To update the VCI

- 1. Power on the tablet.
- Connect the VCI to the tablet via Bluetooth or USB.
- 3. Tap **VCI Manager** on the MaxiPRO Job Menu of the tablet.
- 4. Tap **VCI Update** from the connection mode list.
- The current version and the latest version of the VCI will appear. Tap Update now to update the VCI.
- BAS Update updates BAS firmware via the Internet after the tablet connects the BT506 device via Bluetooth.

#### To update the BT506

- 1. Power on the tablet and the BT506.
- 2. Connect the BT506 device to the tablet via Bluetooth.
- 3. Tap **VCI Manager** on the MaxiPRO Job Menu of the tablet.
- 4. Tap **BAS Update** from the connection mode list.
- 5. The current version and the latest version of the BT506 will appear. Tap **Update now** to update the BT506.
- ② Bluetooth settings displays the type and a partial serial number for all of the devices available for pairing. Tap the desired device to start pairing. The Bluetooth status icon displayed to the left of the device name indicates the received signal strength.

## 14. Support

This application launches the Support platform that synchronizes Autel's on-line service base station with the tablet. The device must be registered to receive support, download software updates and initiate the warranty on your device. The Support application is connected to Autel's service channel and on-line communities. This is the quickest way to connect with Autel's support staff. Here you can quickly submit complaints or send help requests for direct service and support.

## **Product Registration**

Please register your tablet prior to first use. The tablet must be registered to access the Support platform and obtain update and other services from Autel.

#### > To register the diagnostics device

- 1. Visit http://pro.autel.com.
- 2. If you already have an Autel account, sign in with your account ID and password, and skip to step 9.
- 3. If you are a new member to Autel, click **Register** on the left side of the screen to create your Autel ID.
- 4. Enter your personal information. Fields marked with an asterisk (\*) are mandatory.
- 5. Enter your email address, then click **Request**. You will receive an email from Autel with your verification code. Open the email and copy the code into the proper input box.
- 6. Set a password for your account, and enter the password again to confirm.
- Read the Autel User Service Agreement and Autel Privacy Policy, then check the box to accept the terms.
- After all the information is entered, click Register. Once your account is successfully registered, you will be redirected to the Product Registration screen.
   If not, click the button on the screen.
- Your product serial number and password are required to complete your registration. To find your serial number and password on the tablet: go to Settings > About.
- 10. Enter your tablet serial number and password. Enter the CAPTCHA code as shown. And click Submit to complete your product registration.

## **Support Screen Layout**

The Support application interface is navigated by four buttons on the top navigation bar. The operation of each is described below, from left to right:

- Home Button returns to the MaxiPRO Job Menu.
- Back returns to the previous screen.
- Forward moves forward one screen at a time.
- Refresh reload and update the screen.

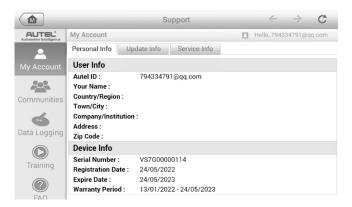


Figure 14-1 Sample Support Application Screen

The main section of the Support screen is divided into two sections. The narrow column on the left is the main menu; selecting one subject from the main menu displays the corresponding functional interface on the right.

## My Account

The My Account screen displays the comprehensive information of the user and the product, synchronized with the on-line registered account, including User Info, Device Info, Update Info and Service Info.

## **Personal Info**

The User Info and Device Info are both included under the Personal Info section.

- User Info displays Autel account information, such as your Autel ID, Name, Address and other contact information.
- Device Info displays the registered product information, including the Serial Number, Registration Date, Expire Date, and Warranty Period.

## **Update Info**

The Update Info section displays a detailed record list of the product's software update history, including the product serial number, software version or name, and the update time.

#### Service Info

The Service Info section displays a detailed record list of the device's repair history, including documenting device faults and repair actions including software installation and component changes. This record is updated to the associated online device and user accounts and synchronized to the Service Info section.

## Communities

The Communities section synchronizes with the Technical Forums on Autel's official websites <a href="www.autel.com">www.autel.com</a> and <a href="www.maxitpms.com">www.maxitpms.com</a> to discuss technical topics or share information, ask for technical advice or offer technical support to other members of Autel's online support communities.

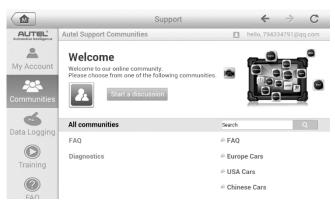


Figure 14-2 Sample Communities Home Screen

#### To start a discussion

- Tap Start a discussion on the Communities Home screen. A list of the major forums displays.
- 2. Select the subject that interests you. For example, if you want to ask a question about the MaxiPRO tablet, tap **MaxiPRO** to start a discussion.
- 3. Enter the topic and the discussion content in the appropriate input field.
- 4. Select a category or edit tags for the discussed post. This will help other members with similar interest to find your post.
- 5. Tap **OK** to submit the post.

## > To join and reply to a discussion post

- Avatar allows you to select an image to set as your personal Avatar to be displayed in the communities.
- Stuff displays all the discussions you've posted at various forums in a list.

## **Data Logging**

The Data Logging section records all sent or unsent (saved) data logs on the diagnostic system. Through the Support platform, personnel receive and process the submitted data log session and then, within 48 hours, send back the corresponding Data Logging session. A resolution is sent within 48 hours. This support method gives the customer direct access to software staff.

## > To reply in a Data Logging session

- 1. Tap on the **Sent** tag to view a list of submitted data logs.
- 2. Select a specific item to track progress of data log review.
- 3. Tap **Send** to send your message to the technical center.

## **Training**

The Training section provides quick links to Autel's online video accounts. Select a video channel to see all Autel's available video tutorials. The videos provide product usage and vehicle diagnostics practices.

## **FAQ**

The FAQ section provides comprehensive references for various frequently asked questions and answers about the use of Autel's online account, and shopping and payment procedures.

- Account displays questions and answers about the use of Autel's online user account.
- Shopping displays questions and answers about online product purchase methods or procedures.
- Payment displays questions and answers about online payment methods or procedures.

## 15. Academy

Autel provides various tutorial articles and technical bulletins produced by top-notch technicians and product experts. Please view the materials that are saved on the tablet or view technical articles from our online forum by clicking the links displayed under this application.

## 16. Remote Desk

The **Remote Desk** application launches the TeamViewer Quick Support program, a simple, fast and secure remote control interface. Use this application to receive ad-hoc remote support from Autel's support technicians by allowing them to control your MaxiPRO tablet on their PC via the TeamViewer software.

## **Operations**

If you think of a TeamViewer connection as a phone call, the TeamViewer ID would be the phone number by which TeamViewer Clients can be reached individually. PCs and mobile devices that run TeamViewer are identified by a unique global ID. This unique ID is generated the first time the Remote Desk application is used and does not change.

The tablet must be connected to the Internet prior to launching TeamViewer.

#### To receive remote support from a partner

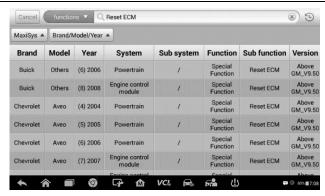


Figure 18-3 Sample Function Viewer Screen 3

This function allows you to examine difficult-to-reach areas normally hidden from sight, with the ability to record digital still images and videos, which offers you an economical solution to inspect machinery, facilities, and infrastructure in a safe and guick way.

Follow these instructions to reduce the risk of injury from electric shock, entanglement and other causes and to prevent tool damage.

- Do not place the imager head into anything or anywhere that may contain a live electric charge or moving parts, which increases the risk of electric shock or entanglement injuries.
- Do not use the imager head cable to modify surroundings, clear pathways or clogged areas.
- When inspection is completed, carefully withdraw the imager head from the inspected area.
- The imager head cable is waterproof to a depth of 3 m (10 ft.). Greater depths may cause leakage into the imager head cable, electric shock or tool damage.
- The working temperature of the imager head is between 32 °F (0 °C) to 113 °F (45 °C).

## Check-Ups:

- FOR AUTOMOBILES: Ensure the automobile is not running during inspection to avoid damage from hot metal and liquid under the hood. Do not get oil or gasoline on the imager head.
- FOR PIPES: If you suspect that a metal pipe may carry electric charge, have a qualified electrician to check the pipe before inspecting it.
- FOR WALLS: Before you inspect the inside of a wall with the imager head, turn off the circuit breaker to the house.
- WORK AREA: Ensure the work area has sufficient light.

## **Additional Accessories**

The Inspection Camera and its fittings are the additional accessories. Both sizes (8.5 mm and 5.5 mm) of the imager head are optional and available for purchase along with the standard tool kit.

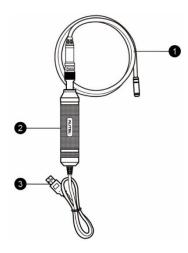


Figure 19-1 MaxiVideo Camera

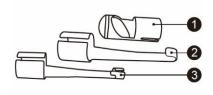


Figure 19-2 8.5 mm Imager Head Accessories

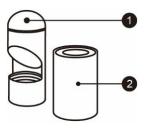


Figure 19-3 5.5 mm Imager Head Accessories

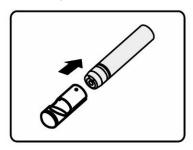

## **Operations**

Before opening the Digital Inspection application, the imager head cable must be connected to the tablet using the USB cable. Install the correct imager head accessories according to the specific needs.

## NOTE

When in operation, the imager head cable can be manipulated so as to better access confined or awkward spaces.

#### > To take images using the Digital Inspection application

- 1. Connect the imager head cable to the USB port on the top of the tablet.
- 2. If not already done, power up the tablet.
- Tap the **Digital Inspection** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu. The Digital Inspection interface displays, showing a camera operating screen. The imager head camera is used by default.
- 4. Select the **Camera** icon at the lower-right corner to take images.
- 5. Focus the image to be captured in the view finder by adjusting and properly locating the imager head cable.
- Tap the blue ring on the screen. The view finder now displays the captured picture and auto-saves the taken photo.
- 7. Tap the thumbnail image on the top-right corner of the screen to view the stored image. Slide the screen left and right to view the images.
- 8. Tap on the selected image and the edit toolbar instantly displays.
- 9. Tap the corresponding button to share or delete an image.
- 10. Tap the **Back** or **Home** button on the Navigation Bar at the bottom of the screen to exit the Digital Inspection application.

#### > To record a video using the Digital Inspection application

- 1. Connect the imager head cable to the USB port on the top side of the tablet.
- 2. If not already done, power up the tablet.
- 3. Tap the **Digital Inspection** application on the MaxiPRO Job Menu. The Digital Inspection interface displays, showing a camera operating screen. The Imager head camera is used by default.
- 4. Select the **Video** icon at the lower-right corner to record a video.
- 5. Properly locate the imager head cable to focus the inspection scene for recording.
- 6. Tap the red ring on the operating screen to start recording.
- 7. Tap the red circle again to stop recording. The recorded video is automatically saved.

- 8. Tap the gallery icon at the bottom-right corner to review all recorded videos.
- 9. Select the corresponding button on the upper-right corner to search or delete a video.

## **20.** Maintenance and Service

## **Maintenance Instructions**

The following shows how to maintain your devices, together with precautions to take.

- Use a soft cloth and alcohol or a mild window cleaner to clean the tablet's touchscreen.
- Do not use any abrasive cleansers, detergent, or automotive chemicals on the tablet.
- Only use the device in dry conditions within normal operating temperatures.
- Dry your hands before using the tablet. The touchscreen may not work if the touchscreen is moist, or if you tap the touchscreen with wet hands.
- Do not store the devices in humid, dusty or dirty areas.
- Before and after use, check the housing, wiring, and connectors for dirt and damage.
- At the end of each work day, wipe the device housing, wiring, and connectors clean with a damp cloth.
